LABOR DAY BIRDERS ON SEP 3. THE BEST BIRD WERE  
PARASITIC TAUCER AND 3 RED KNOT IN CENTRAL  
IOWA. THE PARASITIC TAUCER WAS SEEN THIS  
AFTERNOON AT THE SAVOYVILLE RESERVOIR  
DOCK COUNTY FROM THE CHERRY GLEN AREA, AND  
⑦ 1 RED KNOT WAS AT THE OAK GROVE RECREA-  
TION AREA AND 2 WERE IN THE EAST OF 2  
PINES LOCATED SOUTH OF STORY COUNTY ROAD  
E-63 AND 1 MILE WEST OF HAXLEY. ALSO 11  
CATTLE EGRETS WITH CATTLE AT MECCLEY PRAIRIE  
NORTHEAST OF ROCK CITY AND AN IMMATURE LITTLE  
BLUE HERON AT ROCK CITY WILDLIFE AREA JUST  
EAST OF ROCK CITY.

⑧ IN REPORTS TODAY THE 6<sup>TH</sup> FROM SOUTHEAST IOWA,  
2 SNOWY EGRETS WERE SEEN ALONG WITH SEVERAL  
HUNDRED HERONS AND EGRETS IN FLOODED FIELDS  
ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF HIGHWAY 220 AT THE EAST EDGE  
OF HIGH AMERICA IN IOWA COUNTY. ALSO AT THAT  
LOCATION 20 WHITE PELICANS AND A BUFF-BREASTED  
SNAPPIER. AT THE BABCOCK ACCESS AT THE CORAL-  
VILLE RESERVOIR IN JOHNSON COUNTY, 2 BUFF  
BREASTED SANDPIPER, NUMEROUS SNAPPIERS EGRETS  
AND HERONS; CASPIAN AND BLACK TERNS AND A  
Peregrine Falcon along the Babcock access  
Road which has just emerged from underwater  
in the past few days And from Farrelld, a good  
WADDER MIGRANT THAT IS THE RR TRACKS AT CHATSWOOD PARK

A NUMBER OF REPORTS WERE RECEIVED FROM LABOR DAY BREAKERS TOWARD THE CENTER ELSEWHERE IN CENTRAL COLORADO AND DOWN THE RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN PARK AND MARSH COUNTIES, 17 SHOREBIRD SPECIES WITH ALL 5 REGULAR PLOVERS IN THE STATE SEEN. THE BEST AREA WAS AT THE RANNEILS OVERLOOK INTO THE SAWAN WILDLIFE AREA WHERE THERE WERE PIPING PLOVER, BOTH DOWITCHERS, STILT SANDPIPER, WILSON'S PHALAROPES, SPOTTED LOTS OF PELICANS, 100'S OF GREAT BLUE HERONS AND GREAT EGRET AND WATERFOWL LISTED AS BOTH TEAL, PINTAIL, WIGEON, AND SHOVELERS. NEAR THE SOUTH BANCROFT BOAT LAUNCH AT THE WHITEBREAST RECREATION AREA 5 BUFF BREASTED SANDPIPERS AND 17 BAIRD'S SANDPIPERS IN A GRASSY FIELD. AT THE COLORADO PONDS IN STORY COUNTY AN IMMATURE LITTLE BLUE HERON ON THE FIRST AND 12 SHOREBIRD SPECIES, INCLUDING 2 BUFF BREASTED SANDPIPERS AND A BLACK BELIED PLOVER AS WELL AS WILLET AND BLACK CROWNED NIGHT HERON PLOVER A ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup> AND AT HENDRICKSON MARSH AS ALREADY ON THE FIRST.

IN SOUTHERN COLORADO, AT THE CONCORDIA RESERVOIR, JUST SOUTH OF THE SMALL LAKE ROAD AND WEST OF THE BABLOCK ACCESS, 2 BUFF BREASTED SANDPIPERS, DOWITCHERS AND OTHER SHOREBIRDS ON THE 3<sup>RD</sup>. A, NARRATOR IS THAT GENERAL AREA ON THE 3<sup>RD</sup> AND 4<sup>TH</sup> GREAT EGrets AND A NET NOT

AFTER SEVERAL YEARS WITH VIRTUALLY NO BARN OWL SIGHTINGS IN THE STATE, WE HAVE HAD 2 IN THE PAST SEVERAL WEEKS. THE 2 BIRDS IN NORTHEAST IOWA IN CLAYTON COUNTY FIRST REPORTED BY LARRY STONE ON AUGUST 30<sup>TH</sup>, WERE STILL PRESENT AROUND THE TOWN OF ST. OLAF ON SEPTEMBER 1<sup>ST</sup>. WARBLERS WERE REPORTED FROM SEVERAL PLACES IN THE STATE OVER THE WEEKEND, AND THERE APPEARED TO BE A SIGNIFICANT FAULT. IN SOUTHEAST IOWA, 104 SPECIES OF BIRDS WERE FOUND IN JOHNSON COUNTY ON Sept 1, INCLUDING 15 WARBLER SPECIES, AND 21 FOR THE WEEKEND. ALONG AND WILLOW FlyCATCHERS, AND 15 olive-sided Flycatchers AT THE CORNWALL RESERVOIR AND 4 SPONGARILLS JUST WEST OF THE BASCOC GREEN CATTLE INTERSECTION. ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup>, A <sup>MALE</sup> BLACK THROATED BLUE WARBLER WAS SEEN AT THE CORNWALL RESERVOIR AND A LARGE NUMBER OF WARBLERS IN CEDARS, PINES, AND ARBOR-VITAE AT OAKLAND CEMETERY IN IOWA CITY, INCLUDING CAPE MAY AND BLACK THROATED GREEN, AND A MOURNING WARBLER, AT FAIRFIELD.

IN THE NORTH CENTRAL, AN IMMATURE YELLOW CROWNED NIGHT HERON, JUVENILE RED NECKED GREBE, AND 2 ADULT AND 3 IMMATURE COMMON MOORHEN'S AT UNION SLOUGH NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE IN KOSSETH COUNTY ON AUGUST 28<sup>TH</sup>.
