

TWO VERY INTERESTING BIRDS WERE DISCOVERED IN THE STATE  
OVER THE WEEKENDS, NEW GULL IN POTT COUNTY AND,  
SHARP-TAILED SANDPIPER IN JEFFERSON COUNTY.  
THESE ARE THE WEED HUNTERS  
THE CONTINUOUS PRESENCE OF CALIFORNIA GULL IN POTT COUNTY  
AND SCISSOR-TAILED FLYCATCHER IN MARION COUNTY.

THE SHARP-TAILED SANDPIPER WAS FOUND BY TOM KEST ON  
SATURDAY MORNING THE 14<sup>TH</sup> AT THE CAROLWIL RESEVOIR,  
AND WAS SEEN BY MANY DURING THE LATE AFTERNOON.  
IT WAS IN WITH PECTORAL SANDPIPER AND SWIPE GEMINA  
THERE WERE MANY. TO LOOK FOR THIS BIRD, FROM ~~I-380~~<sup>ENT 4 OF</sup>  
GO WEST ON JEFFERSON COUNTY ROAD F-28 FOR ABOUT  
3 1/2 MILES, TURN NORTH ON CROWEL FOR 1 1/2 MILES, THEN  
WEST ABOUT 1 1/4 MILES TO A WET AREA THAT RINGS TO  
THE NORTHEAST FROM THE ROAD. EARLIER IN THE DAY IT  
WAS AT OTHER WET AREAS FARTHER TO THE WEST ON THE  
NORTH SIDE OF THE SAME ROAD. THIS WOULD BE <sup>ONLY</sup> A THIRD STATE  
RECORD FOR THIS BIRD. IN OTHER NEWS FROM CONKLIN RES-  
ERVOIR ON THE 13<sup>TH</sup> A BIG DAY NETTED 81 SPECIES WITH  
AN AMAZING 14 SPECIES OF SHOREBIRD, INCLUDING, DUNLIN,  
BLUETHROAT, BELLIED PLOVER, SPURGEON, LONG BILLED DowITCHER, AND  
STILT, WESTERN, AND BROAD BILLED SANDPIPER mostly SEEN AT THE  
END OF THE BABCOCK ACCESS ROAD. ALSO 7 BLACK CROWNED NIGHT  
HERONS NEAR THE DEPOT BRIDGE, 13 SPARROW SPECIES INCLUDING  
SHARP TAILED AND HARRIS', 10,000 TREE SWANS, <sup>LATE</sup> TENNESSEE WARBLERS AND HOODED WARBLERS, AN EASTERN PHOEBE  
AND 3 RUSTY BLACKBIRDS. ELSEWHERE IN SOUTHEAST IOWA,  
A PEREGRINE FALCON WAS SEEN NEAR WATERWORKS  
PARK IN FAIRFIELD AND A TREE SPARROW WAS ALSO

SEEN THERE

In THE CENTRAL A SECOND WINTER MEX GULL was  
DISCOVERED, <sup>by RICHARDSON, JAMES DANIEL, AND PETZELICKI</sup> ON A SAND SPIT AT THE BEACH OF  
SANDPIPER RECREATION AREA OF THE Saylorville Res-  
ervoir on THE 13<sup>TH</sup>, BUT CONSIDERABLE SEARCHING  
THERE ON THE 14<sup>TH</sup> FAILED TO RELOCATE IT. <sup>THIS WOULD BE IN STATE</sup> THREE  
BLACK-BELLIED PLOVERS, DUNLIN, FRANKLINS AND  
BONAPARTES GULL AND CALIFORNIA TERN OF SANDPIPER  
ON THE 14<sup>TH</sup>. THIS AREA IS CLOSED FOR THE SEASON, SO  
DROVE THROUGH THE MEADOWS TO THE FAR END OF THE  
PARKING LOT AND WALKED FROM THERE. THE ADULT  
CALIFORNIA GULL IS STILL AT Saylorville AND  
WAS SEEN ON THE 13<sup>TH</sup> JUST NORTH OF THE FESTER  
PARK BOAT LAUNCH AREA, AND ON THE 14<sup>TH</sup> SITTING  
ON AN ISLAND OPPOSITE THE DEAD END ROAD  
JUST SOUTH OF THE HIGHWAY 17 BRIDGE ALSO  
CARVED GREBES WERE JUST ABOVE THE DAM AT  
Saylorville on THE 11<sup>TH</sup>. ELSEWHERE IN CENTRAL IOWA,  
AT UNION GROVE STATE PARK in TAMA County 12  
HERMIT THRUSH, 3 WINTER WREN, ORANGE CROWNED  
WARBLERS AND A SOLITARY VIREO ON THE 10<sup>TH</sup>. THE  
YELLOW RAIL AT SNAKE CREEK MARSH IN COTTRELL COUNTY  
WAS NOT RELOCATED THIS WEEK.

In THE SOUTH CENTRAL, THE SCISSOR TAILED FLYCATCHER  
WAS STILL PRESENT ON THE 13<sup>TH</sup> AROUND THE HOME  
OF EVELYN WRIGHT WHO LIVES IN A BRICK HOUSE,  
WHICH IS THE FIRST HOUSE ON THE EAST SIDE OF HIGHWAY  
5 NORTH OF LOVILLA. CALL EVELYN FOR UPDATES

① THE SECOND WINTER NEW GULL DESCRIBED IN THE  
WEEK'S REPORT WAS SEEN AGAIN TODAY THE 15<sup>TH</sup>  
FOR AN HOUR STARTING AT 3:45 PM. IT WAS WITH  
RING-BILLED GULLS ON THE MOUTH OF 3 SAND SPITS  
AT THE BEACH OF SANDPIPER RECREATION AREA OF THE  
STAYLORVILLE RESERVOIR.

THE SHARP-TAILED SANDPIPER AT THE CORACOMBE  
RESERVOIR WAS SEARCHED FOR BUT NOT FOUND  
ON THE 15<sup>TH</sup>, AND WE HAD NO NEWS EITHER WAY  
ON THE 16<sup>TH</sup>.

DESCRIBED IN THE WEEK'S REPORT  
THE SECOND WINTER NEW GULL WAS SEARCHED FOR  
AT THE SAME CORACOMBE AFTERNOON  
TODAY THE 16<sup>TH</sup> AND NOT FOUND. THERE WERE BLACK  
BELLED PLOVERS AND A LATE BUFF BREASTED  
SANDPIPER AT THE BEACH OF SANDPIPER RECREATION AREA  
AND 2 COMMON LOONS ON THE LAKE.

WE HAVE HAD NO REPORTED SIGHTINGS OF THE  
SHARP-TAILED SANDPIPER AT THE CARROLLVILLE RESERVOIR  
OR NEW CULL AT SAVAGEVILLE RESERVOIR THE PAST 2 YEARS.

A JUVENILE MUTE SWAN WAS REPORTED FROM MARION  
COUNTY TODAY THE 17<sup>TH</sup>. IT WAS LOCATED NORTH OF  
THE RED ROCK DAM WHERE COUNTY ROAD T-15 GOES  
TOWARD PEORIA. THERE IS A LARGE CONCENTRATION OF  
CORN, INCLUDING BONDED COTTON AND KORNKINS,  
NORTH OF KNOXVILLE ALONG HIGHWAY 14 IN THE  
WHITEBREAST CREEK AREA. A CAROLINA WREN HAS  
BEEN PRESENT IN THE UNIVERSITY HEIGHTS AREA OF IOWA CITY  
AT 315 GOLFVIEW FOR THE PAST 2 WEEKS.
