IN NEWS FROM TODAY, THE ADULT CALIFORNIA GULL FIRST DISCOVERED ON THE 8TH WAS STILL PRESENT AT SAWYERVILLE RESERVOIR. THE PAST 5 DAYS, IT HAS BEEN SEEN AT 4 DIFFERENT LOCATIONS IN THE NORTH PART OF THE LAKE - BETWEEN TESTER PARK AND THE MILE LONG BRIDGE, ON A SAND SPIT WITH RING BILLED GULLS JUST NORTH OF THE TESTER PARK BOAT LAUNCH AND NEAR THE MIAMI 17 BRIDGE. ^{BUT IS NOT RECENTLY} ~~IT HAD ALSO BEEN~~ IN THE LATE AFTERNOON ^{17 MAY 1962 + LAST 3 HRS - DARK} EVENINGS AT THE BEACH ON SAWYERVILLE RECREATION AREA, WHERE, A SOUTHERN PELAGIC FALCON WAS SEEN ON THE 17TH. AT THE RUNNER'S GAME AREA IN SOUTHERN PARK COUNTY, 500 WHITE PELICANS, BAIRD'S SANDPIPER, LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER ^{SANDPIPER} AND AN ADULT PEGREGINE FALCON ON THE 15TH.

AT THE BEACH OF THE WINTERBEAST RECREATION AREA AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN MARION COUNTY 13 SANDPIERS, 3 RUDDY TURNSTILES, 2 BAIRD'S SANDPIPER AND A BUFF BREASTED SANDPIPER ALONG WITH 50 CASPIAN AND A FEW FORSTER'S TERNS ON THE 19TH. AND AT MARION COUNTY PARK CAPE MAY WARBLER AND OLIVE-SIDED FLYCATCHER ON THE 19TH.

THE COLD FRONT ON FRIDAY THE 14TH BROKE THE HOT AND HUMID WEATHER PATTERN, PUSHING SOME BIRDS OUT OF THE AREA AND BRINGING NEW ONES IN. THE HIGH-LIGHTS ARE CALIFORNIA GULL, RED KNOT IN EASTERN TOWNSHIP AND BLACK RAK IN THE SOUTHEAST.

ON SEPT 8TH AN ADULT CALIFORNIA GULL WAS
~~SEEN AT THE SPURGEONVILLE RESERVOIR IN PARK COUNTY~~
IT WAS NOT SEEN AGAIN UNTIL FRIDAY THE 14TH, WHEN IT WAS PERCHING AT THE BEACH OF SANDHILL RECREATION AREA UNTIL DARK THAT DAY, BUT WE HAVE HEARD NOTHING ABOUT IT OVER THE WEEKEND. IT WAS WITH A SMALL GROUP OF RIBB-BILLED GULLS, BUT THERE WERE ALSO FRANKLINS AND BONAPARTES GULLS, FORSTER'S GULLS AND COMMON TERNS AND A BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER^{AND A RUDDY TURNSTONE ON THE 14TH} BOBB-BILLED SANDPIPER WITH BAIRD'S SANDPIPER AND SANDPIPERS WERE JUST NORTH OF THE CREEK GLENS RECREATION AREA PARKING LOT ON THE 13TH. ONE RED KNOT WAS STILL BEING SEEN ON THE 15TH IN A MARSHY AREA ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF STORY COUNTY ROAD E-63, ABOUT ONE MILE WEST OF HAYLEY. ALSO THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 16 SHOREBIRD SPECIES INCLUDING LESSER GOLDEN AND BLACK BELIED NOVERS. THE IBIS (LR) WAS LAST SEEN THERE ON THE 11TH, AND THE RED-NECKED PHALAROPES ON THE 13TH. AT SPURGEONVILLE, A LARGE NUMBER OF WHITE PELICANS CAME IN TO THE JETTY PARK AREA OVER THE WEEKEND. THE COLO POND, IN STORY COUNTY, WHICH HAD BEEN SO GOOD ALL

SUMMER ARE DRIED UP NOW. IN OTHER NEWS FROM CENTRAL
TOWNS, ON THE 9TH, A MEGAN WAS SEEN SOUTH OF
LISBON IN MARSHALL COUNTY EATING A SOLES, AT
GRANNY GROVE PARK IN MARSHALL COUNTY, & SWARDS
THESSA, PHILADELPHIA VILLE AND COOPER'S HALL ON
THE 12TH AND 4 BROWN SHIPPED HAWKS OFF THE 14TH.
AT UNION GROVE STATE PARK IN TAMA COUNTY,
A YELLOW BELIED SPARROW WAS ON THE 13TH.

In the southwest, the long-horn bull of Lake Manawa State Park at Council Bluffs,^{Since Sept 4th} has been declared an escapee from the Henry Doorly Zoo in Omaha. On the 12th, 8 projectiles were seen flying over Lake Manawa.

In Southeast Texas, A BLACK RAIL WAS SEEN AT COVE MARSH IN Louise County on THE 16TH. IT WAS FLUSHED WHILE WALKING ALONG THE MAIN EAST-WEST DIKE, AT A POINT 5 FEET BEYOND WHERE THE CULVERT GOES UNDER THE DIKE. FOR MORE INFORMATION CALL KEN LOWMYER AT (319) 351-1207. ALSO SAW AT COVE MARSH, ON THE EAST SIDE NEAR AN ADULT PELAGIC TERN AND LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER. AT HICKORY PIN PARK IN Town City, 14 WADER SPECIES INCLUDING BAY-BREASTED AND PARUS ON THE 16TH, AND AT THE Coopersville RESERVOIR, THE WET AREA ALONG THE BABCOCK ACCESS SO GOOD IN RECENT WEEKS HAS NOW PRETTY WELL DRIED UP.
