SCISSOR-TAILED FLYCATCHERS HAVE BEEN
PRESENT IN MONROE COUNTY SINCE AUGUST 3RD
THEY HAVE BEEN AROUND THE HOME OF EVERETT
WRIGHT WHICH IS THE FIRST HOUSE NORTH OF
LOUILLA ON THE EAST SIDE OF THE ROAD. IT
IS A BRICK HOUSE WITH A BIRD BATH AND
RECENTLY, AT LEAST 1 BIRD HAS BEEN
COMING TO THE BIRDBATH IN THE AFTERNOON.~~

~~IN NEWS ABOUT THE SCISSOR-TAILED FLYCATCHER,
FIRST REPORTED FROM MONROE COUNTY IN SOUTH CENTRAL IOWA
ON THE 24TH, ONE ADULT BIRD WAS STILL BEING SEEN
THROUGH THE 26TH. THERE HAS BEEN 2 BIRDS AT THIS
LOCATION SINCE AUGUST 3RD, BUT RECENTLY ONLY ONE.
THEY ARE BEING SEEN AROUND THE HOME OF EVERETT
WRIGHT WHICH IS A BRICK HOUSE AND THE FIRST
HOUSE, ON THE EAST SIDE OF HIGHWAY 5, NORTH OF LOUILLA.~~

~~AT THE CORALVILLE RESERVOIR IN JEWELL COUNTY ON
THE 27TH, BIRD SEEN AROUND A POND AND MARSHY
AREA ABOUT A MILE NORTHEAST OF SEVEN LAKE
WERE 10 SPARROW SPECIES INCLUDING SCISSOR-TAILED,
LECLANT'S, HARRIS', AND LINCOLN'S, SORA AND VIRGINIA
RAILS, MARSH AND SEDGE WREN. AN AMERICAN
BITTERN WAS AT THE COW CLUB POND AND AN adult BLACK
CROWNED NIGHT HERON SOUTH OF THE POPONT BRIDGE. AND AT
THE END OF THE BABCOCK ACCESS ROAD ALL BIRDS IN THE
WEEKS REPORT WERE PRESENT PLUS BROAD-BILLED DOLBEE.~~

THE STRONG COLD FRONT OF FRIDAY THE 20TH PROBABLY
SENT MOST OF THE LEIS HABITAT MIGRATORS SOUTH OF THE
STATE, AND EVEN BROUGHT IN A REPORT OF SEMI-TELL BIRDS
IN THE NORTHWEST. THE WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS ARE FROM
CENTRAL IOWA, A YELLOW RAIL IN GREENE COUNTY AND
THE CONTINUED PRESENCE OF CALIFORNIA GULL IN PELLOWAY.

THE ADULT CALIFORNIA GULL IN WINTER PLUMAGE, FIRST
REPORTED FROM THE SAWYORAVUE RESERVOIR NORTH OF DES
MOINES ON SEPTEMBER 8TH, WAS STILL BEING SEEN ON
SUNDAY THE 23RD. THE BIRD HAS BEEN MOST RELIABLE
IN THE LATE AFTERNOON AND EVENING AT THE BEACH OF THE
SANDPIPER RECREATION AREA ALONG WITH RING-BILLED
GULLS AND CALIFORNIAN TERNS. IT PROBABLY ROBOTS AT
THIS LOCATION. IT HAS ALSO BEEN SEEN DURING THE
DAYS AT SEVERAL LOCATIONS IN THE NORTH END OF
THE LAKE BETWEEN THE MILE LONG BRIDGE AND
THE HIGHWAY 17 BRIDGE. ON THE 23RD THERE WERE
ALSO 3 LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER AND 10 BUFF BREASTED
SANDPIPERS AT THE SANDPIPER BEACH. THERE ARE SEVERAL
HUNDRED TERN AND PELICANS IN THE JETTER PARK AREA AT SAWYORAVUE RESERVOIR.

THE YELLOW RAIL WAS FOUND ON THE 23RD AT SNAKE
CREEK WILDLIFE AREA IN GREENE COUNTY 1 1/2 MILES
NORTH OF RIPPEY. IT WAS FLUSHED ABOUT 100
YARDS WEST OF THE EAST PARKING LOT. FOR

ALSO IN CENTRAL IOWA AT THE MARSHY AREA

JUST SOUTH OF STORY COUNTY ROAD E-63 A MILE WEST OF HUXLEY, THE WEST POND IS DRY, BUT THE EAST POND HAD LESSER GOLDEN AND BLACK BELIED PLOVER, SWALLOWING, AND LONG BILLED Dowitcher ON THE 23RD.

IN NORTHWEST TOWN IN KOSUTH COUNTY, A LATE MALE SCARLET TANAGER, 3 RED-BREASTED NUTHATCHES, AND 4 PURPLE FINCHES AT AMBROSIE CAUL STATE PARK ON THE 20TH, THE FIRST DARK-EYED JUNCO REPORT OF THE FALL FROM ALASKA IN THE 22ND AND ON THE 23RD 2 AMERICAN BITTERNS AND YOUNG YELLOW-HEADED BLACKBIRD AT UNION BRANCH NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE AND A SWAINSON'S HAWK NEAR BART.

IN SOUTHEAST TOWN AT THE CORNWALL RESERVOIR, ON THE 22ND AND 23RD AT THE END OF THE BARCODE ACCESS, AMERICAN PIPIRS, 4 GOLDEN PLOVER, 3 BOBO'S SANDPIERS AND A BUFF BREASTED SANDPIPER AS WELL AS 100 WHITE PELICANS, 125 GREAT BLUE HERONS AND A THOUSAND DOUBLE CRESTED CORMORANTS. AT SWAN LAKE 5 SOARS AND AN AMERICAN BITTERN AT A POND NORTHEAST OF THESE AND 3 BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERONS NEAR THE DUPONT BRIDGE. AT FAIRFIELD, THE NUMBER OF COMMON SWIFTS ENTERING THE ~~FAIRFIELD~~ CHIMNEY AT FAIRFIELD HIGH SCHOOL HAS DECLINED FROM 4000 ON THE 21ST TO A MEET 2500 ON THE 23RD.
