NEW REPORTS FROM THE 13TH AT THE WET AREA WEST OF HENRY DESCRIBED IN THE WEEK'S REPORT NO 1615, BUT 1 MCLAIN'S AND 1 RED NECKED PHALAROPE, A RED KNOT, LESSER GOLDEN AND BLACK BELLIED PLENTY, VIRGINIA RAIL AND SOOTAS

AND IF YOU ARE IN SOUTHWEST IOWA BIRDS LAKE MANAWA AT CAMP GUL BUFFS AND SEE THE LAUNCHING CAIL, DON'T IMMEDIATELY TACK IT OFF YOUR LIST, AS IT IS A WOLF FROM THE HENRY DOLLEY ZOO IN OMAHA. 8 WOLVES WERE SEEN FLYING OVER LAKE MANAWA ON THE 12TH, PROBABLY NOT ESCAPED

AND AT THE SANDROVUE RESERVOIR IN ROCK COUNTY 16 BUFF OR. SP'S + 3 BARN SWLS NORTH OF THE CHEESE GLEN PARKING LOT AND 1 COMMON TERN (SP) WITH CASPIAN AND FORSTER'S TERNS AT THE SANDPIPER REC AREA BEACH

GOOD BIRD SIGHTINGS RECENTLY PICKED UP THIS PAST WEEK, WITH THE CREAM OF THE CROP CALIFORNIA GULL, RED KNOTS, IBIS, PARASITIC JAEGER AND RED-NECKED PHALAROPES IN CENTRAL IOWA, AND SNOWY EGRET AND RED-NECKED PHALAROPE AT THE CORALVILLE RESERVOIR.

FIRST, CENTRAL IOWA NEWS, ON SEPT. 8TH, AN IBIS SPECIES, 2 RED KNOTS, 7 WILSON'S PHALAROPES AND 2 RED-NECKED PHALAROPES WERE IN A MARSHY AREA ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF STORY COUNTY ROAD E-63 ABOUT A MILE WEST OF HAXLEY. ON THE 9TH, THE IBIS AND PHALAROPES WERE STILL THERE. THE ADULT CALIFORNIA GULL IN WINTER PLUMAGE WAS SEEN AT THE BEACH OF OAK GROVE RECREATION AREA AT THE SAILORVILLE RESERVOIR ON THE 8TH; BUT WE HAVE HAD NO NEWS FROM THE 9TH. ANOTHER RED KNOT WAS AT OAK GROVE ON THE 3RD. THE JUVENILE PARASITIC JAEGER WAS AT SAILORVILLE ON SEPTEMBER 3RD, ONLY, WITH NO LATER SIGHTINGS. ALSO ON THE 3RD, 11 CATTLE EGRETS AT MECKLEY MARSH NORTHEAST OF POLK CITY, AND 2 IMMATURE LITTLE BLUE HERONS AT THE POLK CITY WILDLIFE AREA EAST OF POLK CITY. AT THE COLO PONDS IN STORY COUNTY ON THE 8TH AND 9TH, IMMATURE BLACK AND YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERONS, 3 AMERICAN BITTERNS, 2 RED-NECKED PHALAROPES, AND SOARS. AT WOLF CREEK PARK IN CRANBERRY COUNTY 14 UNUSUAL SPECIES ON THE 6TH, INCLUDING CANADA, GOLDEN WINGED AND MOURNING WARBLERS AND AT GRAMMER GROVE COUNTY PARK IN MARSHALL COUNTY ON THE 8TH 13 WARBLER SPECIES WITH MOURNING, AS WELL AS 4 OSPREYS AND 1 SHARP-SHINNED HAWK.

IN SOUTHEAST IOWA AT THE CORALVILLE RESERVOIR IN JEFFERSON COUNTY, BIRDS SEEN ALONG THE BABCOCK ACCESS ROAD ON THE 7TH, 8TH AND 9TH INCLUDED; 2 SNOWY EGRETS IN WITH GREAT EGRETS, A TOTAL OF 16 SHOREBIRD SPECIES INCLUDING RED-NECKED PHALAROPE, RUDDY TURNSTONE, 3 BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER, SANDPIPERLS, STILT SAND-PIPER AND LESS GOLDEN PLOVER, ^{WHITE PELICANS} CASPIAN AND BLACK TERN, AND PEREGRINE FALCON AND MERLIN. THE BABCOCK ACCESS IS REACHED BY GOING 1 3/4 MILES NORTH OF NORTH LIBERTY ^{ON HIGHWAY 45}, THEN WEST 3 3/4 MILES. AN AMERICAN BITTERN WAS SEEN ALONG THE HANGING ROCK ROAD IN THE FIRST POND ON THE EAST SIDE ON THE 9TH. ANOTHER AREA WITH EXCELLENT HABITAT FOR SHORE AND WATER BIRDS IS IN IOWA COUNTY JUST SOUTH OF HIGHWAY 220 AT THE EAST END OF HIGH AMADA. ON THE 7TH, THERE WERE 2 SNOWY EGRETS, BUFF BREASTED SANDPIPER, WHITE PELICANS, AND A PEREGRINE FALCON AT THAT LOCATION.
