

THE WEEKEND WEATHER WAS CERTAINLY FOR THE DUCKS, AND OVERNIGHT THE DIVING DUCKS POURRED INTO THE STATE BEHIND THE STRONG FRONAL PULSE. THE BEST OF THE WATERFOWL WERE PACIFIC LOON AT RED ROCK AND RED THROATED LOON AT CORACONVILLE. THE FIRST WINTER CALIFORNIA GULL AND LESSER BLACK BACKED WERE STILL BEING SEEN AND A VARIED THRUSH WAS FOUND IN JONASON COUNTY.

THE RED THROATED LOON WAS FIRST SEEN THE MORNING OF NOVEMBER 4<sup>TH</sup> FROM THE WEST OVERLOOK CAMP GROUNDS AT THE CORALVILLE RESERVOIR, AND WAS REDISCOVERED AND STILL PRESENT AT DUCK SURVEY NORTHS OF THE MENAFFEY BRIDGE WHERE JONESON COUNTY ROAD F-28 CROSSES THE RESERVOIR. THREE WHITE-TAILED SCOTERS WERE IN A LARGE RAFT OF DUCKS AT THE MENAFFEY BRIDGE ON THE MORNING, BUT THEY WERE REDISCOVERED AT THE TOLLEY RIVER AREA IN THE AFTERNOON. THERE WERE ALSO 240 COMMON LOONS AT TOLLEY RIVER. THERE WERE SPOTTED GEESE, ALL 3 MALLARD SPECIES, Ruddy Duck, Bufflehead, AND THE FIRST COMMON GOLDENEYE AT MENAFFEY AND TOLLEY RIVER. IN THE SPRUCE AREA, A MALE VARIED THRUSH WAS FOUND <sup>ON THE 4TH</sup> AT THE MACBRIDE FIELD CAMPUS, THE ENTRANCE TO WHICH IS A HALF MILE NORTHEAST OF THE MENAFFEY BRIDGE ON F-28. THE BIRD WAS LAST SEEN ACROSS THE ROAD FROM THE ENTRANCE TO CAMP GROUNDS ONE IN THE LATE AFTERNOON. AT THE END OF THE BABLOCK ACCESS ROAD AT CORACONVILLE,

ON THE 4<sup>TH</sup>, THERE WERE SEVEN SHOREBIRD SPECIES,  
INCLUDING DUNLIN, LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER AND LONG-  
BILLED DOWITCHER<sup>AND</sup><sup>AND AMERICAN PIPI</sup> SO WHITE PELICAN, THE FIRST  
WINTER CALIFORNIA GULL FIRST REPORTED FROM THAT  
LOCATION THE PREVIOUS WEEKEND WAS STILL PRESENT,  
AT LEAST THROUGH THE 3<sup>RD</sup>. AND A FLOCK OF EIGHT  
RED CROSSBILLS, ACCOMPANIED BY RED BREASTED  
NUTHATCHES WERE IN A GROUP OF PINE TREES AT THE  
WEST END OF THE CORNUVILLE DAM NEAR THE SPILLWAY  
ON OCTOBER 31<sup>ST</sup>.

IN SOUTH CENTRAL IOWA, AT THE RED ROCK RES-  
ERVOIR IN MARION COUNTY, THE BEST OBSERVATION  
POINT FOR THE LARGE RAFT OF WATERFOWL HAS BEEN  
WHITEBREAST POINT. ON NOVEMBER 3<sup>RD</sup>, PACIFIC  
LOON, WHITE-WINGED SCOTER, EARED AND HORNS  
GREBES, AND COMMON LOONS WERE SEEN THERE,  
AND A WESTERN GREBE ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup> THE FIRST  
WINTER LESSER BACK-BACKED GULL WAS STILL BEING  
REPORTED FROM BELOW THE RED ROCK DAM ON THE  
3<sup>RD</sup>.

IN CENTRAL IOWA, AT THE SPRUCEWOOD RESERVOIR  
ON THE 3<sup>RD</sup> A LATE OSPREY, AND AT SANDPIPER  
RECREATION AREA BEACH, LESSER GOLDEN AND SEMI-  
PALMATED PLOVER, LEAST SANDPIPER AND AMERICAN  
PIPI. 3 SANDGRINS WERE AT BEACH OF OAKLEAF  
RECREATION AREA AND A WHITE-WINGED CROSSBILL  
WAS AT CAMPGROUND 4 AT TESTER PARK. ON THE

31<sup>st</sup> A NORTHERN SHRIKE WAS AT THE END OF 108<sup>th</sup>  
STREET AT BIG CREEK STATE PARK. AND THE RED  
SHOULDERED HAWK HAS RETURNED FOR ITS WINTER  
WINTER IN THE AREA ALONG HIGHWAY 415 BETWEEN  
THE DICK CITY CASEY'S STORE AND THE  
ENTRANCE TO SANDPIPER RECREATION AREA.
