

WEEK'S REPORT

A NUMBER OF RECENTLY EXCELENT WATER-RELATED BIRDS WERE FOUNDED IN THE STATE THIS PAST WEEK, INCLUDING PACIFIC LOON,
ALL THE 5 GREBES^{SPECIES, EXCEPT CLARK'S}, ALL 3 SCOTERS, AND 2 UNUSUAL GUINS, PLUS
2 RAPTORS, PRAIRIE FALCON AND GOSHAWK.

IN THE CENTRAL PART OF THE STATE AT THE SAYLORVILLE RESERVOIR IN POLK COUNTY, ON THE 28TH, A RED NECKED GREBE WAS SEEN FROM THE JETTEL PARK BOAT RAMP LOOKING TOWARD THE BIG CREEK SWIMMING, WESTERN, GREEN AND HORNSHED GREBES WERE ALSO ON THE LAKE NEARBY THE DAM, BLACK AND SURF SCOTERS, 2 COMMON LOONS, AND 12 DUCK SPECIES INCLUDING RUDDY, AND BUFFLEHEAD WERE ALSO SEEN ON SAYLORVILLE LAKE. ALSO AT SAYLORVILLE, 9 AVOCETS, AND FLOCKS OF AMERICAN PIPISTRELLS AT THE BEACH OF SANDPIPER RECREATION AREA, THE PRAIRIE FALCON WAS FLYING ALONG THE WEST SIDE OF THE SAYLORVILLE DAM AND A NORTHERN GOSHAWK WAS SPOTTED IN MADISON COUNTY, BOTH ON THE 28TH. ON OCTOBER 25TH AT LITTLE WAU LAKE IN HAMILTON COUNTY, A PACIFIC LOON, PLUS WHITE-WINGED AND SURF SCOTERS. ANOTHER WESTERN GREBE WAS AT BIG CREEK STATE PARK ON THE 28TH AND THE FIRST PINE SISKIN REPORT OF THE SEASON CAME FROM LISCOMB IN MARSHALL COUNTY ON THE 28TH.

IN THE SOUTH CENTRAL, A FIRST YEAR LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL WAS PICKED OUT OF A LARGE GROUP OF HERRING AND RING-BILLED GULL BELOW THE DAM AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR ON THE 27TH. TWO COMMON LOONS WERE ABOVE THE RED ROCK DAM, AND A HORNSHED MEGABIRD WAS SEEN ON A LAKE

~~In Johnson County a flock of 8 red crossbills and some red breasted nuthatches were in a group of pine trees at west end of the Corolville dam near the Spillway on the 31st.~~

~~In new reports, the first winter California bair will still present today at the Corolville Reservoir today.~~

At Red Rock Reservoir in Marion County, birds seen on the 30th ~~were~~ included 11 waterfowl species, including Hooded Merganser and Black and Ruddy Ducks, 20 common Loons, Eared and Horned Grebes, Rough Legged Hawks and an adult Bald Eagle, while in the area where Whitebreast Creek crosses Highway 14 north of Knoxville, 20 American Pipits and a Lapland Longspur.

~~In the Southwest we had a belated report from several days ago of November 16th, at Willow Slough Wildlife Area in Mills County. Although bald is possible, white faced is the expected species, in Iowa, and in the fall it is extremely difficult to identify any birds as to species.~~

~~And a Bald Eagle was seen in Cass County near Cedar Valley Park on the 28th.~~

TODAY
Reports from Polk County, there were 2 white winged scoters seen from Oak Grove Recreation Area, and at Oak Grove on the 29th, (15 Smith's and Lapland Longspurs) and American Pipits. A white winged crossbill was at Campground 4 of Foster Park and a Northern Shrike was sighted at the end of 100th Street at Big Creek State Park, both on the 31st.

SEEN THERE ON THE 28TH 6 SHOREBIRD SPECIES
INCLUDING DOWITCH AND BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER, 1
FRANKLIN'S AND 7 BONAPARTES LAYS, ~~1~~ WHITE
PELICANS AND RUFFED LEGGED HAWK, LAYLAND LIMIDAY,
AND AMERICAN PINTAIL.
