

IN NEWS REGARDING THE 4 HIGHLIGHT BIRDS IN THE WEEK'S
REPORT, THE SHARP-TAILED SANDPIPER, AND MEW GULL ^{AT THE CAROLINE RESERVOIR} ^{AT THE SANDPIPER} HAVE BEEN
SEARCHED FOR AND NOT RELOCATED, THE SUBER TAILLED FLU-
VATONNA WAS NOT BEEN REPORTED EITHER WAY AND THE
CALIFORNIA GULL WAS SEEN ON THE 18TH AT SANDPIPER
RECREATION AREA AT THE SPALDINE RESERVOIR. ALSO SEEN AT
SANDPIPER THE PAST TWO DAYS WERE 3 SANDPELINGS, A BUFF
BREASTED SANDPIPER, BLACK BELLED PLOVER, BAIRD'S SAND-
PIPER AND A DOZEN AMERICAN PIPITS.

THE JUVENILE MUTE SWAN FIRST SIGHTED ON THE 17TH WAS
STILL PRESENT TODAY THE 19TH A MILE NORTH OF THE
RED ROCK DAM WHERE MARION COUNTY ROAD GOES OFF
TOWARD PELLA. ^{THESE IS} A LARGE CONCENTRATION, OF GULLS
INCLUDING FRANKLIN'S AND BIRCHMARTIN'S
