In news from the 5th in the southeast in northern Des Moines County, a pair of NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRDS was near Kingston, and in northern Lee County, at least three YELLOW-BREASTED CHATS were found. From the village of Augusta in Des Moines County, cross the Skunk River and turn right on Old Quarry Road. Proceed 3.7 miles and look on a brushy hillside on the left.

In Story County, BELL'S VIREO and WILLOW FLYCATCHER were at Doolittle Prairie north of Ames.

No rare birds have been reported in the state this past week, but interesting nesting birds continue to be found.

In the southeast in Johnson County, on the Coralville Reservoir breeding bird survey on the 3rd PROTHONATARY and KENTUCKY WARBLERS, BROWN CREEPER, PILEATED WOODPECKER, and ACADIAN FLYCATCHER were seen at the Hanging Rock Woods, and the singing YELLOW-THROATED WARBLER was still in sycamore trees at the entrance to the Cottage Reserve Area at Lake MacBride State Park on the 3rd. On the 29th, a singing PRAIRIE WARBLER was found at Lake MacBride south of the sailboat storage enclosure, and YELLOW-THROATED WARBLER, PILEATED WOODPECKER, and YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT were at the Big Bend Area of the Coralville Reservoir. In Lee County, KENTUCKY WARBLER, WHITE-EYED VIREO, and ACADIAN FLYCATCHER were at the Croton Unit of Shimek State Forest on the 30th,

and in Van Buren County at and near Lacey-Keosauqua State Park, there were YELLOW-THROATED and CERULEAN WARBLERS, NORTHERN PARULA, SCARLET TANAGER, ACADIAN FLYCATCHER, and HENSLOW'S SPARROW on the 30th.

In the central in Madison County, an early returning WILLET and a COMMON TERN were at Badger Creek State Park on the 1st. In Boone County, a singing CHESTNUT-SIDED WARBLER, as well as ACADIAN FLYCATCHER, VEERY, and CERULEAN WARBLER were at the Holst Forest on the 29th.

In the northeast in Allamakee County on the 1st, a family of KENTUCKY WARBLERS was seen at the Yellow River State Forest about fifty yards down the Evergreen Trail from the fire tower. There were also CERULEAN WARBLER, NORTHERN PARULA, and ACADIAN FLYCATCHER there, as well as at the Marching Bear Area of Effigy Mounds National Monument, and a CERULEAN WARBLER was singing at the parking lot at Pike's Peak State Park. In Winneshiek County, a BELL'S VIREO was at the Coon Creek Area on the 29th.
