The cold front on Saturday night the 27th brought a nice passerine fallout. Shorebirds continue to be seen in good numbers where habitat is present. The week's highlights are COMMON BLACK-HEADED GULL, KING RAIL, and WESTERN GREBE in the northwest, SNOWY EGRET in Lee County, and the PACIFIC LOON continues in Hamilton County.

In the northwest in Dickinson County, an adult COMMON BLACK-HEADED GULL was still being seen on the 26th sitting on the rock jetty at the north end of Big Spirit Lake near Mini-Wakan State Park. In Kossuth County on the 27th, a KING RAIL was again located at Stateline Marsh on the north side of the blacktop toward the west end of the marsh. There was also a BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON there. Stateline Marsh is a mile south of the Minnesota line along county road A-16, two miles west of its intersection with P-30. In Clay County, a WESTERN GREBE and BREWER'S BLACKBIRD were at Trumbull Lake on the 28th, and ten warbler and three vireo species were seen, including MOURNING WARBLER.

In the central in Hamilton County, the PACIFIC LOON was still at Anderson Lake just east of Jewell on the 28th. Walk the railroad tracks along the south side of the lake and look north. In Marshall County there were 14 warbler species at Grammer Grove Park on the 28th, which included CANADA and BAY-BREASTED, as well as OLIVE SIDED FLYCATCHER and GRAY-CHEEKED THRUSH. In Tama County at Otter Creek Marsh, ten shorebird species, including BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER, were just north of the parking lot at the east end of the south dike, and two immature LITTLE BLUE HERONS were along the east end of the north dike on the 27th. In Story County, there have been up to ten shorbird species near the boat

ramp at Hickory Grove Park, with five BUFF-BREASTED SANNDPIPERS there on the 23rd. In Polk County in the Saylorville Reservoir area on the 28th, there were 13 warbler species with the best a CONNECTICUT at the Polk City Wildlife Area, and 13 shorebird species, with BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER off of Jester Park.

In the southeast in Lee County on the 28th, two CATTLE EGRETS were in Mississippi River backwater at the north edge of Montrose, 225 AMERICAN WHITE PELICANS were at the Heron Bend Conservation Area three miles north of Montrose off of hiway 61, and two miles farther north, five SNOWY EGRETS were at the Devil's Creek Access along 263rd Avenue east of hiway 61.

In the west in Ida County, 16 warbler species were found on the 28th, and included MOURNING, BLUE-WINGED, GOLDEN WINGED, and NORTHERN PARULA.
