ON THE WARTHWEST IN DICKINSON COUNTY, THIE WHITE-WINGED SCOTER WAS STILL BY THE SPIRIT LAKE KISH HATCHERY GROWNS WHICH IS ON THE ISTRIMUS BETWEEN EAST OKOBOTI AND BIG SORT LAKES. IT WAS ON A POND TAMBLESTELY WELT OF THE HATCHELY BUILDING. The strong weather systems of last week brought a big flight of waterfowl into the state, including a number of unusual species. The biggest surprise, however, was a SELASPHORUS type HUMMINGBIRD in Cedar Rapids, while Linn County provided a hat trick of three SCOTERS, as well as a PACIFIC LOON. Other highlights were SURF SCOTER, WHITE-WINGED SCOTER, RED-NECKED GREBE, and MEW GULL in the southeast, EURASIAN WIGEON in the southwest, and BLACK SCOTER and OLDSQUAW in the central, AND WAITE WINGEA SCOTER AND WESTERN LARGE IN THE NORTHWAST

In the northeast in Linn County, a SELASPHORUS type HUMMINGBIRD, most likely an immature male RUFOUS, has been coming to a feeder in Cedar Rapids through the 5th, The feeder is in the backyard of Barb Stark, 238 24th Street Drive, SE. To get there, head northeast on First Avenue, and at St. Matthew School, rurn right onto 24th Street Drive. At the house, walk to the right of the garage, and in the backyard the bird has been often sitting in the bush near the feeder. A late CHIPPING SPARROW was also at a feeder there on the 5th. Elsewhere in Cedar Rapids, a female BLACK SCOTER was at Cedar Lake through the 4th, and at Pleasant Creek Recreation Area north of Palo, there were four male WHITE-WINGED SCOTERS, and a female SURF SCOTER on the 5th, a very late BARN SWALLOW on the 4th, and a PACIFIC LOON on the 3rd.

In the southwest in Harrison County, a male EURASIAN WIGEON was at the visitor's center at DeSoto NWR on the 3rd. There are now an estimated 400,000 waterfowl at DeSoto.

In the southeast in Appanoose County, a first year MEW GULL was found at the

swim beach northwest of the dam at Lake Rathbun, on the 4th. In Marion County, a male SURF SCOTER and a female WHITE-WINGED SCOTER were seen on the lake at the Bos Landen development southwest of Pella, and a RED-NECKED GREBE was off the Coalport Boat Ramp at Red Rock Reservoir, all on the 4th. In Johnson County, a first-year THAYER'S GULL was at the swim beach above the dam at the Coralville Reservoir on the 4th, and in Louisa County, a late GREAT EGRET was at Cone Marsh AND A MORTHERN SHRIKE WAS AT THAT LOCATION ON THE STE on the 5th.

In the central in Story County, a male OLDSQUAW was still being seen on the 1rst on the south pond of the Hallett Quarry along hiway 69 at the north edge of Ames. In Hardin County, the female BLACK SCOTER was still at Upper Pine Lake northeast of Eldora on the 3rd. In Marshall County, an adult MUTE SWAN was on a quarry along county road S-57 about 7 to 8 miles north of St. Anthony, on the 4th. In Polk County, the best birds seen on the IOU field trip on the 4th, were two EARED GREBES at Saylorville Lake, and five BAIRD'S SANDPIPERS, a BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER, and LONG-EARED OWL off 100th Street at Big Creek State Park. In Poweshiek County, a RUSTY BLACKBIRD was observed at Arbor Lake in Grinnell on the 3rd, and a HARLAN'S RED-TAILED HAWK was seen near Diamond Lake near Montezuma on the 4th. In Madison County, the first NORTHERN SHRIKE report of the season came from near Badger Lake State Park on the 1rst.
