The passerine migration has been stalled this past week by the heat and south winds, although the first DARK-EYED JUNCOS and RUBY-CROWNED KINGLETS were reported.

The big news is in Sac County, where a LONG-TAILED JAEGER and SABINE'S GULL have been present for about a week. Other good birds are RED-NECKED PHALAROPE in Tama County, WESTERN GREBE in Clay County, and the PACIFIC LOON, which continues in Hamilton County.

In the northwest in Sac County, Pete Ernzen discovered an adult LONG-TAILED JAEGER on the 4th, and the following day an immature SABINE'S GULL was located. Although the JAEGER was originally found at Tomahawk Marsh, which is along

county road M-68 about two and a half miles north of Lake View, both birds were seen the rest of the week at Black Hawk Lake in the town of Lake View. They were either flying over the lake or sitting on the lake surface, especially in the southeast portion of the lake. They were also on a dredge pond which is across the road from the southeast corner of Black Hawk Lake. This pond has a levee around it, and you must walk onto the levee to see in. There were interesting shorebirds on the pond last week, including AMERICAN AVOCET, BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER, and SANDERLING. In addition, a PEREGRINE FALCON was spotted over the lake on the 7th. At Tomahawk Marsh, there have been a GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE and an immature YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERON.

Elsewhere in the northwest in Clay County, two WESTERN GREBES were at Trumbull Lake on the 5th, and in Sioux County, a male MERLIN was near Hawarden on the 7th.

In the central in Tama County, a RED-NECKED PHALAROPE was still being seen on the 10th at Otter Creek Marsh at the east end of the south dike, and four SANDHILL CRANES were still there on the 7th. In Hamilton County, the PACIFIC LOON which has been at Anderson Lake just east of Jewell for about two months now, was still present on the 10th, as was an immature YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERON.
