IN MARSHALL COUNTY, 2 RED SHOULDERED HAWKS AND A GOLDEN EAGLE WERE REPORTED FROM THE RAPTOR WATCH AT GRAMMER GROVE PARK ON THE 6TH.

ON THE 9TH IN JOHNSON COUNTY, 14 TUNDRA SWANS WERE ON THE CORALVILLE RESERVOIR JUST NORTH OF THE MENAFFEE BRIDGE, AND 2 HORNED GREBES WERE ON THE NORTH ARM OF LAKE MACBRIDE. IN THE CENTRAL IN HAMILTON COUNTY ~~2~~ ~~HOVED~~ ~~AND~~ HORNED GREBES AND COMMON LOONS WERE AT LITTLE WALK LAKE.

ON THE 10TH IN THE WEST IN MONROE COUNTY, A WESTERN GREBE WAS AT BLUE LAKE. IN THE CENTRAL IN TAMIA COUNTY 6 SACR WERE AT OTTER CREEK MARSH AS SEEN FROM R AVENUE AND E-66.

ON THE 11TH IN NORTHWEST IOWA IN SULLY COUNTY, 2 IMMATURE GOLDEN EAGLES WERE AT THEIR WINTERING LOCATION, ^{OVER THE WALKER TOWN DAM BLUFF} ALONG COUNTY ROAD H-26, 5 1/2 MILES SOUTHWEST OF HIGHWAY 26. AND 197 TUNDRA SWANS WERE 2 MILES NORTH OF LOCK + DAM #9 NORTH OF HARPER'S FERRY. IN HARDIN COUNTY, AN IMMATURE SURF SCOTER WAS AT UPPER PINE LAKE.

Reports from all parts of the state indicate the growing number of waterfowl and gulls. WESTERN GREBE, a bird that is uncommonly seen in Iowa, was unusually well represented this past week. Other good birds are all three SCOTER species, OLDSQUAW, and SANDHILL CRANE.

in the south-central in Marion County, among the several thousand waterfowl at Red Rock Reservoir on the 6th, three WESTERN GREBES and an OLDSQUAW were seen from the visitor's center at the south end of the dam, while a HORNED GREBE and 37 COMMON LOONS were observed from Whitebreast Point. At the north end of Roberts Creek Lake, there were four species of shorebird on the 6th, with DUNLIN and LONG-BILLED DOWITCHER.

In the northwest in Dickinson County, 17 COMMON LOONS, two WESTERN GREBES, and 96 BUFFLEHEADS were on Big Spirit Lake on the 5th, and four WESTERN GREBES, four HORNED GREBES, and seven COMMON LOONS were on West Okoboji Lake on the 6th. In Clay County, two WESTERN SANDPIPERS were along the Little Sioux River north of Spencer on the 6th. In Woodbury County, there were 90-100 SANDHILL CRANES and three BLACK SCOTERS at New Lake near the Port Neal generating station on the 3rd.

In the central in Tama County, four SANDHILL CRANES were still at Otter Creek Marsh on the 3rd, and were seen by looking south from the intersection of county road E-66 and R Avenue. In Polk County, an adult male WHITE-WINGED SCOTER was off the face of the dam at the Saylorville Reservoir on the 4th and 5th, and an unusually late GREAT EGRET was at the Polk City Wildlife Area on the 5th.

In the southwest in Pottawattamie County, there were five WESTERN GREBES and 16 HORNED GREBES at Lake Manawa State Park on the 5th, and in Cass County, a SURF SCOTER was near

the swim beach at Lake Anita State Park on the 6th.

In northeast Iowa in Linn County, there were 12 HORNED GREBES, and an EARED GREBE at Pleasant Creek Recreation Area north of Palo on the 6th. In Allamakee County, 50 TUNDRA SWANS were on pool #9 of the Mississippi River north of Harper's Ferry on the 3rd, and three AMERICAN WOODCOCK were still at Effigy Mounds National Monument on the 3rd.

In the southeast in Iowa County, among the five shorebird species at the Amana Lily Lake bewteen Main and Middle Amana on the 6th, was an AMERICAN AVOCET.
