On the 24th in the central in Hardin County, a female BLACK SCOTER was at Upper Pine Lake northeast of Eldora, and in Marshall County, a GOLDEN EAGLE and ROUGH-LEGGED HAWK were seen at the Grammer Grove Park hawk watch.

In news from Iowa County, Jim Scheib reports that on the 22nd, he saw a warbler of the MOURNING-MACGILLIVRAY'S complex at the start of the Amana Nature Trail near Homestead. The prominent, but broken eye ring he observed, suggests a MACGILLIVRAY'S.

On the 26th ^{in updates}, the ~~BLACK SCOTER~~ was still at Upper Pine Lake in Hardin County, and the RED PHALAROPE was still off campground #4 at Jester Park. In the southwest in Union County, an adult PACIFIC LOON with a very discernable chin strap was near the boat ramp at Twelve Mile Lake east of Creston. Unfortunately it soon disappeared flying south. An EARED GREBE was also there. In the southeast in Appanoose County, 13 HORNED GREBES and 4 COMMON LOONS were observed from the Island View Area at Lake Rathbun, and in Marion County, a late FORSTER'S TERN was at the north end of Roberts Creek Lake. In the central in Jasper County, a LECONTE'S SPARROW was at the Jacob Krumm Wildlife Area southwest of Grinnell on the 25th.

In news from the 25th in the central, a WESTERN GREBE, 3 HORNED GREBES, and two COMMON LOONS were at Little Wall Lake in Hamilton County. In Polk County, a RED PHALROPE, plus seven other shorebird species, which included BLACK-BELLIED PLOVERS and a SANDERLING, as well as AMERICAN PIPITS, were all seen off campground #4 at Jester Park. In southeast Des Moines, a MUTE SWAN was near the bathhouse at Easter park.
