In the southeast in Appanoose County, 13 HORNED GREBES and 4 COMMON LOONS were observed from the Island View Area at Lake Rathbun, and in Marion County, a late FORSTER'S TERN was at the north end of Roberts Creek Lake. In the central in Jasper County, a LECONTE'S SPARROW was at the Jacob Krumm Wildlife Area southwest of Grinnell on the 25th.

In news from the 25th in the central, a WESTERN GREBE, 3 HORNED GREBES, and two COMMON LOONS were at Little Wall Lake in Hamilton County. In Polk County, a RED PHALROPE, plus seven other shorebird species. which included BLACK-BELLIED PLOVERS and a SANDERLING, as well as AMERICAN PIPITS, were all seen off campground #4 at Jester Park. In southeast Des Moines, a MUTE SWAN was near the bathhouse at Easter park.
