ON THE 14TH, IN THE NWTH SAC CO.
GULL WAS STILL AT BLACK HAWK LAKE. IN THE
SOUTHWEST, IN JOHNSON COUNTY, A YELLOW RAIL
WAS SEEN ALONG THE ^{LAKE} MACBRIDE NATURE TRAIL
ONLY ABOUT 200 YARDS FROM ITS END IN SELON
AND A PEREGRINE FALCON WAS ABOUT A MILE AND
A HALF IN FROM THE SELON END. IN DES MOINES
COUNTY, WE HAD A LATE REPORT OF A JUVENILE
SHARP-TAILED SANDPIPER SEEN THE EVENING OF THE 13TH,
BUT TO THE MORNING OF THE 14TH AT CASEY-
BARROW PUBLIC LANDING ^{ON THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER ABOUT} 10 MILES NORTH OF BURDICTON

On the 10th in Polk County at the Saylorville Reservoir, five AMERICAN AVOCETS were at the beach of the Sandpiper Recreation Area in the evening.

In news recieved the 9th in the central in Polk County off campground #4 at Jester County Park, one juvenile SABINE'S GULL, the RED KNOT, and SANDERLINGS were still present, while a first-year BLACK-LEGGED KITTIWAKE was another quarter mile upstream and around the bend from there, all on the 8th.

In the southeast at the Coralville Reservoir, a LECONTE'S SPARROW was seen in the weeds northeast of the campground beach changing house at the Sugar Bottom Recreation Area on the 8th.

AND FOR THE WEEK'S REPORT OF MONDAY MORNING OCTOBER 9TH
The week's highlights are FISH CROW and CALIFORNIA GULL in the southeast, SABINE'S GULL, YELLOW RAIL, RED KNOT, and SNOWY EGRET in central Iowa, SABINE'S GULL in the northwest, and BLACK-LEGGED KITTIWAKE at Council Bluffs.

In the southeast, Tim Dwyer reported a FISH CROW at Muscatine on the 2nd, and we have had no further news this week. You can call Tim for more information at (319)263-8741. In Marion County, an adult CALIFORNIA GULL and a CATTLE EGRET were found on the 7th at Red Rock Reservoir in the area of the old submerged bridge near the intersection of hiway 14 and county road G-28.

In central Iowa in Polk County, a juvenile SABINE'S GULL, a RED KNOT, and SANDERLINGS were seen on the 4th on the mudflats at the upper end of the Saylorville Reservoir, as viewed from campground areas 4 and 6 at Jester County Park. On the 2nd, in the Runnells Bottoms area, there were eleven shorebird species and a YELLOW RAIL. In Jasper County, a SNOWY EGRET was found on a farm pond which is just south of Colfax near the intersection of hiway 117 and 44th Avenue on the 7th.

In the northwest in Sac County, at least one juvenile SABINE'S GULL was still being seen along the southeast corner of Black Hawk Lake on the 7th, and in Ida County, a late CANADA WARBLER was at Moorehead County Park on the 8th.

In the southwest in Pottawattamie County, the BLACK-LEGGED KITTIWAKE was still being seen along the west side of Lake Manawa at Council Bluffs on the 4th, and at Hitchcock Nature Center, nearly a hundred SWAINSON'S HAWKS and a NORTHERN GOSHAWK passed by early last week.

In the northeast in Clinton County, a WINTER WREN was at Westbrook Park in DeWitt on the 7th.
