The week past saw a flurry of reports of unusual waterfowl, loons, grebes, and scoters. In fact, virtually every body of water in the state must have COMMON LOONS and HORNED GREBES, judging from information we received. There was also if irst sightings for the year of COMMON REDPOLL. The highlight birds were BLACK SCOTER, PACIFIC and RED-THROATED LOONS, RED PHALAROPE, and COMMON REDPOLL in the central, WHITE-WINGED SCOTER and PACIFIC LOON in the southwest, and PACIFIC LOON and AMERICAN AVOCET in the southeast, and common reduced in the southeast.

In the central in Polk County at the Saylorville Reservoir, a RED-THROATED LOON was discovered on the 29th from the Cherry Glen boat ramp looking south, A COMMON REDPOLL was seen on the 29th at Red Feather Prairie, which is found by going west on the dead end road which leaves hiway 415 just south of the Cherry Glen entrance. Park in the lot, and walk south along the bike trail a mile to where it curves east. The RED PHALAROPE was last reported on the 26th. It was seen at the upper end of the Saylorville Reservoir from campground area 4 at Jester Park. Seven other shorebird species, including BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER and SANDERLING, as well as AMERICAN PIPITS, were also there on the 26th. In southeast Des Moines, a MUTE SWAN was near the bath house at Easter Lake on the 25th. In Hamilton County, the PACIFIC LOON was still being seen at Little Wall Lake on the 29th, and a WESTERN GREBE was there on the 25th. In Hardin County, the female BLACK SCOTER was being seen at Upper Pine Lake northeast of Eldora at least through the 27th. In Marshall County, a GOLDEN EAGLE and ROUGH-LEGGED HAWK were seen at the Grammer Grove Park hawk watch on the 24th. In Jasper County, a LECONTE'S SPARROW was found at the Jacob Krumm Wildlife Area
