The bitter weather put the clamps on birding activity, and we have not had a single report since Thursday. The past week's highlights are BLACK-BILLED MAGPIE in the northwest, COMMON REDPOLL in the northeast, PRAIRIE FALCON in the central, and EVENING GROSBEAK in the southeast.

In the northwest, a BLACK-BILLED MAGPIE was seen once again in Plymouth County on the 6th. For details on the location, call Bill Huser at (402)494-1657 or Randy Williams at (712)276-3618. On the 5th, two LONG-EARED OWLS were in the cenetery on the east side of LeMars.

In the northeast in Clayton County, a COMMON REDPOLL was being seen regularly at Larry Stone's feeder near Elkader, at least through the 7th. You can call Larry at (319)245-1517. In Franklin County, a NORTHERN SHRIKE was seen along I-35 near mile marker #159 on the 7th.

In the central in Guthrie County, a PRAIRIE FALCON was spotted at Bay's Branch on the 6th.

In the southeast in Johnson County, a pair of EVENING GROSBEAKS visited Ken Lowder's feeder north of Iowa City on the 5th and 6th, but they have not been seen since. On the 7th, a first-year GLAUCOUS GULL was below the Coralville Reservoir dam, and a LONG-EARED OWL was in a grove of small pines near the entrance to the sailboat storage enclosure at Lake MacBride State Park.
