Obeservers last week reported concentrations of hundreds, up to two thousand, WHITE PELICANS at several locations around the state, and RED-BREASTED NUTHATCHES were widely reported. There were also good raptor flights through the state, especially of falcons and accipiters. The highlights were PARASITIC JAEGER, YELLOW RAIL, and SHARP-TAILED SPARROW in the central part of the state, and an unconfirmed report of an ANHINGA came from Marion County.

In the central in Polk County, a PARASITIC JAEGER paid a brief visit to the Oak Grove Recreation Area at the Saylorville Reservoir the morning of the 22nd. Elsewhere at Saylorville, three AMERICAN PIPITS were at Cherry Glen on the 21rst, and at the Snadpiper Recreation Area beach there was a MERLIN, and two SHARP-TAILED SPARROWS were at the end of the peninsula on the 25th. The IOU field trip to Snake Creek Marsh in Greene County on the 25th produced a number of SHARP-TAILED and LECONTE'S SPARROWS, both SEDGE and MARSH WRENS, SORAS, AMERICAN WOODCOCK, BOBOLINKS, and two MERLINS. For the day, the group saw ten raptor and 7 warbler species. Another MERLIN and a PEREGRINE FALCON were in the Des Moines River valley west of Madrid on the 25th. On the 21rst, two YELLOW RAILS were at Snake Creek Marsh on the top of a low hill about a hundred yards northwest of the parking lot.

In the northeast in Linn County, there were seven COMMON TERNS, as well BONAPARTE'S GULLS at Pleasant Creek Recreation Area north of Palo on the 25th.

In the northwest in Sioux County, MERLINS were at Rock Valley Wildlife Area on the 21rst, and near Oak Grove Park on the 24th. In the southeast in Iowa County, there were eleven shorebird species, including BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER, as well as a HORNED GREBE and PEREGRINE FALCON, at the Lily Lake bewteen Main and Middle Amana on the 22nd. In Johnson County, a MERLIN hit a window north of Iowa City on the 22nd. Jim Fuller (319)338-3561
