This week saw very few reports, but the EURASIAN COLLARED DOVES continued in the central, and MARBLED GODWIT and RED-NECKED PHALAROPE were seen in the southeast.

In the central, the EURASIAN COLLARED DOVES were still being seen at Grinnell, as at least two birds were still present on the 3rd. Here are the directions: From hiway 146 at the north edge of Grinnell, go east on 16th Street until you see the country club golf course on the south side of the road. Then look and listen for the birds in the next quarter mile. Elsewhere, in Polk County, a BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER was at the Big Creek Wildlife Area on the 2nd, and in Story County, a COMMON LOON was on Hallett's Quarry along hiway 69 at the north edge of Ames on the 2nd.

In the southeast in Johnson County on the 4th, 14 species of shorebirds were observed east of the end of the Babcock Access at the Hawkeye Wildlife Area. They included MARBLED GODWIT, RED-NECKED PHALAROPE, BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER, and SANDERLING. At Iowa City, 12 species of warblers, including MOURNING WARBLER, were seen at Hickory Hill Park.
