The strong cold front of the middle of last week moved a number of migrants in the state, most notably sparrows, kinglets, and late warblers. The highlights are two SABINE'S GULLS in the northwest, and the early appearance of a THAYER'S GULL in the southeast part of the state.

In the northwest in Sac County, an immature SABINE'S GULL was present at Black Hawk Lake at Lake View on the 6th, while in Dickinson County, we have had no news since the 3rd about the SABINE'S GULL reported at Orleans Beach Access on the south shore of Big Spirit Lake. In Kossuth County, ten species of shorebirds, including a HUDSONIAN GODWIT, were found on the 5th at Union Slough NWR along the blacktop north of the headquarters, and on the south side of county road B-14, which is where the GODWIT was located. In Cherokee County, a MERLIN was observed near Marcus on the 3rd.

In the central in Greene County, LECONTE'S and NELSON'S SHARP-TAILEDS PARROWS were at Snake Creek Marsh, two miles northeast of Rippey, on the 3rd.

In the southeast in Johnson County, some of the birds found at the Hawkeye Wildlife Area on the 3rd included PEREGRINE FALCON, THAYER'S GULL, NELSON'S SHARP-TAILED SPARROW, DUNLIN, six species of warbler, and lingering migrants EASTERN KINGBIRD and INDIGO BUNTING. The PEREGRINE was along the Babcock Access road, and the other birds were along Greencastle Avenue north of the Swan Lake Road.
