There has been only one report this week. It is disconcerting that no one has provided news either way concerning the BLACK-HEADED GULL in Dickinson County, which was last reported on July 31rst.

In the central in Hamilton County, a RED-NECKED GREBE in basic plumage was found at Anderson Lake on the 4th and 6th. From the town of Jewell, go east on hiway 175, and after passing the south end of the lake, go north on the first gravel road, and park. Walk west along the railroad tracks, and look for the bird to the south. Be patient, as it is hard to find, staying hidden in the reeds most of the time. The four TRUMPETER SWANS at Anderson Lake were released there in the past two weeeks.
