In the central in Marion County, a SABINE'S GULL was spotted at the Red Rock Reservoir on the 18th. It was over Whitebreast Bay, as seen from the road leading to the old swim beach, which is now an island. In Poweshiek County, two EURASIAN COLLARED DOVES were still present at Grinnell on the 15th.
