on the rd in the SE, Chuck Fawcett observed an immature Brown Pelican just above L & D #8 of the Mississippi. It was north of BX, between the Tchoupitoulas Side of the river where he saw it. You can call Chuck for more information at (319) 753-0710.

In the NW in Sac County @ Beach Hawk Lake at Lake View there were 2 Wigeon, a Rnck, and a Hgr, while on the 31st, 30 Sacs flew over that location.

In the NC in Custer County CO, there were 7 species of ducks including a Red-necked Grebe on ^{the} ~~North~~ Clear Lake as viewed from the Farmer's Beach Rd. The number around the exotic many produced was 100s of thousands on the ice.

In Marshall County at the Hawkwatch at Gemmer Grove County Park on the 31st, a Red Shouldered Hawk and Red Osprey flew over and on the 27th of the 116 raptors, there were 95 RTND, 5 BRED, 2 RLND, 4 NONR, and a GYRFALCON.

ON THE 31ST IN THE SOUTHEAST, A PRAIRIE FALCON WAS OBSERVED ROOSTING ~~ROOFTOP~~ IN DOWNTOWN DAVENPORT. THE BIRD WAS IN THE MIDAMERICA ENERGY BUILDING, ON A ^{SOUTH FACING} LEDGE JUST BELOW THE ROOF. WE ALSO HAD TWO REPORTS FROM THE CENTRAL IN JADEER COUNTY, INDICATING THE NEW WALSHUT CREEK NWR 2 MILES SOUTH AND A MILE WEST OF PRAIRIE CITY. A SWET EARED OWL WAS SEEN ON THE 31ST AND A PRAIRIE FALCON WAS SPOTTED ^{PRAIRIE RIGGINS IN THE} THE 30TH. THE OWL WAS IN THE BISON FIELDS NORTH OF 96TH AVENUE, WHILE THE FALCON WAS IN A SWIFT SOUTH OF 96TH AVENUE. YOU MAY DRIVE THE ROAD IN THE REFUGE, BUT CHECK WITH THE OFFICE IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO HIKE IN THE AREA.

~~NEVER~~ ALSO ON THE 30TH IN POLK COUNTY, 5 SHOREBIRDS WERE STILL PRESENT IN THE WINDS AT ^{THE BROOK} SANDHILL RECREATION AREA OF THE LAMORANCE RESERVOIR. THEY INCLUDED LEAST, BONAPART'S, AND PECTORAL SANDPIPER AND DUNLIN.

The best birds this week are SABINE'S GULL and WHITE-WINGED SCOTER at Red Rock.

In the southeast in Marion County, in the Red Rock Reservoir Area, an adult SABINE'S GULL was seen flying back and forth off Whitebreast Point on the 24th and 25th. Look for the three-toned upperwing pattern, and the full dark hood. Also off Whitebreast Point were two adult male WHITE-WINGED SCOTERS and seven HORNED GREBES. An immature CATTLE EGRET was below the Red Rock Dam, and at the north end of Robert's Creek Lake, there were six species of shorebirds, including BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER and BAIRD'S SANDPIPER. In Des Moines County, there were still fifty shorebirds ^{mostly shorebirds} off the Casey-Barrow Public Landing on the Mississippi River about ten miles north of Burlington on the 26th.

In the northeast in Blackhawk County, a HORNED GREBE was just off the boat ramp at George Wyth State Park on the 23rd.
