✓ D.C. Corm	c.350	4/19	one flock migrating Fremont Co. (B. Wilson)
✓	c.600	4/24	4 separate flocks migrating Fremont Co. Myers, Moore → (RM, FM)
✓ Am Black Duck	6	3/20	Riverton: rarely seen in spring; appear to be getting more common (see also CBC data)
✓ Greater Scaup	1♀	3/20	near Shenandoah: gravel pit. (Same size as nearby Redhead)
✓ Sharp-shinned Hawk	1♀	5/2	Fremont Co. large size, square tail, head not extended from front of wings. Late date.
✓ Am. Kestrel	c.50	3/20	Unusually common, even at peak migration Fremont Co.
✓ Piping Plover	2	4/24	Riverton. Breeders are ^{RM, FM} probably early migrants.
✓ L. Golden Plover	45	4/24	Riverton. Large ^{RM, FM} group for this area.
✓ Lesser Yellowlegs	ca 1100	4/24	Obviously peak of migration 4/24 Riverton
E. Phoebe			Easier to find than usual this spring.
✓ Scissor-tailed Flycatcher	1	4/24	with RM, FM north of Wankensie S.P. (see attached documentation)
✓ B. G. Gnatcatcher Loggerhead Shrike	1	5/15	TK, TS. Unusual in sw Iowa. Wankensie. Rather common in Fremont Co. Perhaps more so than usual, especially near my house.
✓ Yellow Warbler	1♂	4/24	FM, RM. Riverton. Early date.
