On the 5th in the southeast, a RUDDY TURNSTONE still in alternate plumage was observed at the Casey-Barrow Mississippi River access, about ten miles north of Burlington.

To skip the recording and leave a message, just press the star at any time. With the birding summer doldrums still upon us, it was relatively quiet again last week, although a few good birds were reported.

In the southeast in Des Moines County, a PIPING PLOVER was sighted on the 31st at the Casey-Barrow Mississippi River Access about ten miles north of Burlington. On the 28th in Johnson County, an AMERICAN AVOCET was found at the S & G Quarry along Sand Road at the south edge of Iowa City. We had no news about either juvenile LAUGHING GULL, both of which had been seen along the Mississippi River, one in Lee County on the 23rd, and the other in Muscatine County on the 27th.

In the northwest in Kossuth County, seven BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPERS were spotted on the 2nd at the Maynard Reese WPA, which is west of Union Slough NWR.

In the northeast in Winneshiek County, BAIRD'S SANDPIPERS were among the seven species of shorebirds found at the Ft. Atkinson sewage treatment plant, and two YELLOW-BELLIED SAPSUCKERS were at Lake Meyer County Park, south of Calmar, both on the 30th.
