IN NEWS RECEIVED THE 20TH, IN JOHNSON COUNTY THE VARIOUS THRUWAS STILL AT THE SCHEIDT'S FEEDER ~~ON THE 20TH~~ ON THE 20TH IN LINN COUNTY, THE RED SHOULDERED HAWK WAS STILL IN ROBINS, THIS TIME IN THE PARK ALONG THE CREEK 4 BLOCKS SOUTH OF MAIN STREET, AND ANOTHER ^{PSHA} WAS IN BENTON COUNTY AT THE FRY WILDLIFE AREA ON THE CEDAR RIVER. IN NORTHERN FRANKLIN COUNTY, A FLOCK OF 2000 LAPLAND LONGSPURS WERE JUST WEST OF I-35. IN LEE COUNTY AN ADULT GRAY-CROWNED GULL AND A FIRST YEAR THAYER'S GULL WERE NEAR THE ELEVATOR ON THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER SOUTHWEST OF WEVER. IN MARION COUNTY, THERE WERE STILL 3 WHITE PELICANS BELOW THE RED ROCK RESERVOIR DAM.

The brief springlike weather of last week brought a few waterfowl and gulls back into open water in the south, and flocks of robins appeared. The highlight is a PRAIRIE CHICKEN in Cherokee County.

In the northwest, the GREATER PRAIRIE CHICKEN was sighted once again on the 19th near Cherokee. This presumably wild bird was seen about a month ago for several days. At that time, it was at the south edge of Cherokee along highway 59 on the ^{EAST} west side of the road near the Indian store, and on the ^{WEST} east side at the airport, and near the fairgrounds. In Ida County, two LONG-EARED OWLS were at Crawford Creek Recreation Area, two miles south of Battle Creek on the 16th, in the first pine planting as you enter the park.

In the southeast in Johnson County, the male VARIED THRUSH was last seen on the 16th at the feeder of Jim and Sharon Scheib, 10 Longview Knoll, north of Iowa City. For updates, call the Scheibs at (319)337-5206. On the 20th, two NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWLS were found in cedar trees along the north side of county road F-20, 0.7 miles west of the Hawkeye Wildlife Area headquarters.

In the northeast in Linn County, a PEREGRINE FALCON was seen both the afternoon of the 17th and the morning of the 18th flying over Hawkeye Downs in southwest Cedar Rapids, and on the 16th, a male HOODED MERGANSER was at Cedar Lake in Cedar Rapids.

In the central in Story County, the flock of ten COMMON REDPOLLS present since December, was seen again on the 18th in alders near the main building at the State Forest Nursery at Ames.
