All spring we have not received a report of YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT, and this week we have three. The week's highlights are PURPLE GALLINULE and SANDHILL CRANE in Bremer County, PRAIRIE WARBLER in Johnson County, WESTERN GREBE in Cerro Gordo County, and LEAST TERN in the southwest.

In the northeast in Bremer County, the PURPLE GALLINULE was seen again at the same location at Sweet Marsh on the 11th. It took the observer four attempts in two days, so be patient and persevere. Here are the directions: From the south part of Tripoli, go east on 7th Avenue for 1.8 miles, and turn north into the south entrance to the marsh. Drive to the end of the road and walk onto the dike by a sign that says "Danger Ditch". Proceed 160 long paces to where there are two dead trees in the marsh. The bird has been in the area of these trees. Also, a SANDHILL CRANE was a flyover at Sweet Marsh on the 11th. In Blackhawk County, once again this year, SWAINSON'S HAWKS are nesting at the Hartman Preserve in Waterloo. In Linn County, the PEREGRINE FALCON nest is still active with young atop the Firstar Bank Building in downtown Cedar Rapids. A YELLOW-THROATED WARBLER was still present on the 11th in sycamore Trees along the Sac & Fox Trail at the Indian Creek Nature Center in southeast Cedar Rapids. To look for it, exit Mt. Vernon Road south onto Old Bertram Road and go to a parking lot on the left, and walk the trail for about 200 yards. The best birds on the Cedar Rapids Audubon's breeding bird census on the 11th, in addition to the YELLOW-THROATED WARBLER, were LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE, LEAST FLYCATCHER, and four BLUE-WINGED

WARBLERS at Squaw Creek Park.

In the north-central in Cerro Gordo County, two WESTERN GREBES were at Zirbel Slough on the lake south of the road on the 11th. Also present were BLACK and FORSTER'S TERNS, and a FRANKLIN'S GULL.

In the south-central in Madison County, four COMMON TERNS and a COMMON LOON were at Badger Creek State Park on the 12th. In Warren County, four NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRDS were seven miles south of Martensdale, and a YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT was at Rolling Thunder Prairie on the 8th. For more information on any of these birds, call Eugene Armstrong at (515)996-2726. In Wayne County, six GREAT-TAILED GRACKLES were at farm ponds near the Missouri border. From Seymour, go south on county road S-60 for four miles. Then, after the road turns east, the ponds are on either side of the road.

In the southwest in Pottawattamie County, two LEAST TERNS and four PIPING PLOVERS, including two young, were at the South IPL Pond on the 11th.

In the southeast in Johnson County, the singing male PRAIRIE WARBLER was seen once again at the MacBride Nature and Recreation Area on the 9th. To look for this bird, go north from North Liberty on county road F-28 for about 3-4 miles to the entrance. From the entrance, proceed 0.4 miles and look on the brushy hillside to the right. Also at MacBride on the 11th were ACADIAN FLYCATCHER, and CERULEAN and PROTHONOTARY WARBLERS. In Lee County, two YELLOW-BREASTED CHATS were seen on the 12th. From the village of Augusta in Des Moines County, cross the Skunk River, and turn right on Old Quarry Road. Proceed 3.7 miles and look on the brushy hillside on the left.

In the central, another YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT was found on the 12th. It was seen from a parking lot for the bicycle trail, which is west of the Casey's store just south of Polk City.
