As is usual this time of year, rare birds make a brief appearance, and are seen by only one or a few poeple. And so it was last week with the WESTERN TANAGER in Johnson County, the FISH CROW, which is a potential first state record, in Louisa County, and the LARK BUNTING in Des Moines County. Other good sightings were WESTERN GREBE, BEWICK'S WREN, YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERON, and SHORT-EARED OWL. We had no news either way about the CINNAMON TEAL in Dickinson County.

In the northwest in Clay County, a WESTERN GREBE was on Trumbull Lake on the 1rst, while in Dickinson County, 15 shorebird species, including a WILLET at McBrean Marsh, were seen on the 29th.

In the southeast in Lee County, a BEWICK'S WREN was found on the 30th. From the small parking lot at the Croton Unit of Shimek State Forest northwest of Argyle, go north about a half mile to 150th Street, and then east to the second house, and look and listen by the junked machinery. In Van Buren County, 15 warbler species, including CERULEAN and YELLOW-THROATED, were at Lacey-Keosauqua State Park, and a SHORT-EARED OWL was near there on the 29th. To look for the owl, from hiway 1 in Keosauqua, go west on county road J-40 for 5.4 miles to where there are red barns on both sides of the road. Pull off on the south side, and look over the field and fenceposts to the south and east. In Louisa

County, birds seen at Cone Marsh over the weekend included in the northwest corner a YELLOW-CROWNED, and five BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERONS, and at the south end, WILLET, WILSON'S PHALAROPE, DUNLIN, both DOWITCHER species, and AMERICAN PIPIT. On the 26th, there were four CATTLE EGRETS in the northeast corner.

In the west in Monona County at South Blue Lake on the 29th, there was an immature SWAN Sp., and 15 shorebird species, including HUDSONIAN GODWIT, BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER, LONG-BILLED DOWITCHER, WILLET, and WHITE-RUMPED SANDPIPER, while on the 30th there was a PEREGRINE FALCON.

In the northeast in Winneshiek County, there was a WILLET and CLAY-COLORED SPARROW at Cardinal Marsh on the 27th. In Allamake County, the first AMERICAN REDSTART returned to Effigy Mounds on the 29th. In Linn County, the PEREGRINE FALCON nest atop the Firststar Bank building in downtown Cedar Rapids is active with eggs.

In the southwest in Fremont County, four AMERICAN AVOCETS, seven WILLETS, and a CATTLE EGRET were at Forney Lake on the 27th, while in Pottawattamie County, a WILLET was at the South IPL Pond on the 27th.
