① ON THE 10TH IN THE NORTHWEST IN ALLAMAKEE COUNTY A FAMILY OF KENTUCKY WARBLERS WAS SEEN ^{AT THE YELLOW RIVER STATE FOREST} ~~ABOUT~~ NEAR THE FIRE TOWER ABOUT 50 YARDS DOWN THE PUEBLO TRAIL. THERE WERE ALSO CERULEAN WARBLER AND NORTHERN PHOENIX IN THAT AREA, AS WELL AS IN THE MARCH BEAR AREA OF THE EFFIGY MOUNDS NATIONAL MONUMENT AND CERULEAN WARBLER WAS AT THE PARKING LOT AT PIKE'S PEAK STATE PARK

ON THE 28TH IN THE SOUTHEAST IN JOHNSON COUNTY, THERE WERE 2 YELLOW THROATED WARBLERS IN Sycamore TREES AT THE ENTRANCE TO THE COTTAGE RESERVE AREA AT LAKE MACBRIDE

~~ON THE 28TH IN THE SOUTHEAST,~~ IN DES MOINES COUNTY, 2 CASPIAN TEAL WERE AT THE CASEY BORROW PUBLIC ACCESS 10 MILES NORTH OF BURLINGTON

ON THE 26TH, IN JOHNSON COUNTY, 3 NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRDS WERE NEAR WILLIAMS PRAIRIE, 1 ABOUT A HALF MILE SOUTHEAST AND A PAIR ALONG THE LANE JUST WEST OF THE PRAIRIE ENTRANCE.

~~IN LOUISA COUNTY, AT STRANGE CREEK, WHICH IS THOUGHT TO BE A RED-NECKED WAS STILL AT ONE MARLIN POND AT FLAMING PRAIRIE PARK, THE ENTRANCE TO WHICH IS OFF OF COUNTY ROAD X-61 ABOUT 9 MILES SOUTH OF MUSCATINE~~

IN THE NORTHWEST IN CLAY COUNTY, BOTH AMERICAN AND LEAST BITTERNS WERE SEEN ALONG THE ROAD INTO TRUMBULL LAKE AND AT STONE STATE PARK IN SIOUX CITY, THERE ARE KENTUCKY WARBLERS

(A) ~~ON THE 29TH~~ IN JOHNSON COUNTY, A SINGING MALE PRAIRIE WARBLER WAS AT LAKE MACBRIDE STATE PARK IN A BRUISING FIELD SOUTH OF THE SALMON STORAGE ENCLOSURE ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE NORTH ARM OF THE LAKE. IN THE BIG BEND OF THE COPLIN RESERVOIR AREA, YELLOW THROATED WARBLER, PILEATED WOODPECKER, AND YELLOW BREASTED CHAT WERE SEEN.

The week's highlights are YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERON in Fremont Count, LEAST TERN and PIPING PLOVER in Pottawattamie County, and Prairie Warbler in Lee County.

In the southwest in Fremont County, an immature YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERON and two CATTLE EGRETS were at Secret Lake on the 24th and 25th. And at a nearby wet spot, there were two LESSER YELLOWLEGS, a little unusual for June. Secret Lake is reached by taking county road J-34 west from its intersection with L-44 for about one and a half miles, and then south on a Level B road for about three-quarters of a mile. In Pottawattamie County, at the Midwest Energy (Formerly IPL) south pond, there were five LEAST TERNS, including one sitting on a nest, plus two PIPING PLOVERS on the 24th. You can find this area by taking exit #42 of I-29 and then following the gravel access road north about a mile and a half along the west side of the interstate.

In the southeast in Lee County, there were ten warbler species at the Croton Unit of Shimek State Forest on the 25th 24th. They included PRAIRIE, HOODED, WORM EATING, CERULEAN, KENTUCKY, BLUE-WINGED, NORTHERN PARULA, and LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSH. There were also WHITE-EYED VIREO, ACADIAN FLYCATCHER, and PILEATED WOODPECKER.

In the south-central in Marion County, a BLACK-THROATED GREEN WARBLER was singing on the 23rd just east of the ranger's house at Cordova Park. In Appanoose County, two UPLAND SANDPIPERS were along county road J5T, about three miles west of the Rathbun Reservoir Visitor's Center on the 25th.
