In the northeast, at Cedar Rapids on the 31rst, unusual winter waterfowl that were at Cedar Lake with the MALLARDS and CANADA GEESE, included a male CREEN-WINGED TEAL, a female WOOD DUCK, a PIED-BILLED CREBE, and a DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANT. On the 29th, 48 sepcies were found on the Yellow River Forest Christmas count, with a WHITE PELICAN and 7 TUNDRA SWANS on the Wisconsin side of Pool #9 of the Mississippi River above Harper's Ferry, and on the Iowa side, a BALD EAGLE was observed collecting a HOODED MERGANSER. On the 27th, Decorah recorded 45 species with two GOLDEN EAGLES and an amazing 104 RED-TAILED HAWKS.

In the central, a flock of 15 COMMON REDPOLLS was in a line of trees with catkins near the main building at the State Forest Nursery at Ames on the 27th. We have had no more news this week about the SNOWY OWL in Boone County, last reported on the 21rst.

In the east-central at Lock & Dam #14 on the Mississippi River at LeClaire, a MUTE SWAN and a DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANT were present on the 31rst.

In the south-central in Marion County, two BLACK DUCKS were on the Des Moines River near the old iron bridge below the Red Rock Reservoir Dam on the 2nd.
