OF YELLOWWAGS.

(S) In De C in Story Co, a Rock in  
bare place was seen on Dr 28<sup>E</sup> + 2a<sup>S</sup>  
on one of the Colo Ponds. At 2 1/2 mi  
E of Colo on CR E-41 + back to the south  
bank it was on the first "pond" on  
S side of R. and "In a small depression  
in the St in Lee Co, 2 ~~W~~ ~~W~~ were  
at the Crater end of Shrub SF on the  
28<sup>E</sup>. They were in the first valley  
to the S opposite where the path crosses  
the stream. They were about 100 yds  
up from the point but on the  
Ran were KENO, CLEW, Bluet, Acft &  
Lowa. 8 Nov. 1900. On the 29<sup>E</sup> on  
Colo were still @ the 5th Guard  
along the Sand Road from S of  
Ic.
