In the north-central in Cerro Gordo County north and west of Thornton, a SNOWY OWL was observed near the intersection of Eagle Avenue and 160th Street, and a possible FERRUGINOUS HAWK was seen along 130th Street between Eagle and Dogwood Avenues, both on the 25th.

In the southeast in Cedar County, a male VARIED THRUSH was present in

the northeast part of West Branch in the yard of Sally Erickson at 521 E. Orange Street all last week through the 24th, but was not
