V, Would be VI except for old records in Wisconsin (Sept 1852 Milwaukee, 1851 La Cross, Sept 1868 Racine -- Barger et al.) and Illinois (Madison Co. Aug 24, 1880, Fayette Co. July 28, 1888 -- Bohlen).

7. (188). *Tantalus loculator* Linn. Wood Ibis.

This species was listed by J. A. Allen (White's Geol. of Iowa, 1870, ii. p. 426). Kumlien and Hollister state: "There are recorded several captures of this southern species within the state. Can be classed only as a very rare midsummer straggler at the present day, however" (Birds of Wis., 1903, p. 32). "A few ascend the Mississippi Valley, where they have been taken in Indiana, Illinois, Missouri, Wisconsin and Kansas" (Cooke, Bird Migr. in Miss. Val., 1884-85, p. 80).
