The Barrow Golden-eye is a very rare or infrequent visitor in the state. This is even a more hardy species than the preceding and is most apt to occur in the winter where open water is found. A specimen in the University museum was taken at Independence Oct. 11, 1892, by Robert E. Leach, (C. C. Nutting, Proc. Iowa Acad. Sci., 1892, 40). It was reported from Pottawattamie and Mills as a "rare migrant" (Trostler); Linn—"rare winter visitant" (Berry); Lee—"rare winter resident—Keokuk district" (Praeger); "rare winter visitant" (Currier).

"Last year one was sent me from near the Iowa state line which was a typical bird, and Dr. Hvoslef (Lanesboro) has a female of this species in typical plumage" (Hatch, Bds. of Minn., 65). "A rare winter visitant in eastern Nebraska; more numerous westward. Reported from Omaha," etc. (Rev. Bds. Neb., 28-29).

DuMont 193**3** p 155 Glaucionetta islandica (Gmelin). Barrow's Golden-eye

There is no satisfactory evidence for including this species. Anderson (1907) recorded a specimen in the University of Iowa Museum, taken by Robert E. Leach at Independence, October 11, 1892 and identified by C. C. Nutting. A recent examination has shown this to be a female G. clangula americana. Anderson listed several field observations none of which were sufficiently satisfactory to establish a record.

Roberts (1932) recorded that the specimen from Fillmore County, Minnesota, listed by Hatch (Birds of Minn., 1892) proved to be G. c. americana.
