On the 2nd in the central in Polk County, the BROWN PELICAN was seen again at the Saylorville Reservoir, but this time just north of the Mile Long Bridge, rather than from Campground #4 at Jester Park. At the Sandpiper Beach Recreation Area, there was a flock of 30 AMERICAN PIPITS. In Poweshiek County, the adult MUTE SWAN was still at Diamond Lake west of Montezuma on the 30th.

In the northwest in Kossuth County, north of the HQ there were 11 shorebird species, including 6 AMERICAN AVOCETS and 9 BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER, while in the south pool there were 4 TRUMPETER SWANS.

On the 1st, in the northwest in Dickinson County, a BLACK-HEADED GULL in basic plumage was seen along the north shore of Big Spirit Lake, and a WESTERN GREBE, a number of COMMON LOONS, and two HORNED GREBES were also present on Big Spirit. Two SPOTTED TOWHEES and a PINE SISKIN were also seen.

In the northeast in Cerro Gordo County, the EURASIAN COLLARED-DOVE discovered at Mason City in August continues to be seen in the northwest part of that town in the neighborhood of the General Foods plant. The specific location is in the alley behind 1121 12th Street, NW .

In the south-central in Madison County, a CONNECTICUT WARBLER was spotted in the southern part of the county on the 30th.

IN NEWS RECEIVED THE 27TH

There are several reports from the past weekend. First in the northeast in Allamakee County, a PEREGRINE FALCON passed over the Effigy Mounds hawk watch area on the 25th.

In the northwest, at a hawk watch at Pilot Knob SP in Hancock County, PEREGRINE FALCON, MERLIN, and SWAINSON'S HAWK were seen.

In the southeast in Lee County, an AMERICAN BITTERN has been present at Pollmiller Lake near West Point. In Wapello County, birds seen at the wetland east of the Ottumwa bypass on the 25th included BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER, AMERICAN PIPIT, and PEREGRINE FALCON.

Fall migration is progressing as would be expected. There are still a few WARBLERS being seen, and other arrivals reported this week include SPARROWS of several species, WINTER WREN, YELLOW-BELLIED SAPSUCKER, BROWN CREEPER, both KINGLETS, and DARK-EYED JUNCO. The weeks best bird, a BROWN PELICAN, continues at the Saylorville Reservoir. An IBIS (Sp.) and a BLACK-THROATED BLUE WARBLER were seen in Cerro Gordo County.

On the 26th in the central in Polk County, the BROWN PELICAN was seen all day with WHITE PELICANS from the overlook at Campground #4 at Jester County Park. There were six RED-NECKED PHALAROPES at that location as well. Other birds seen this past week there include, PEREGRINE FALCON and BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER on the 22nd, and MARBLED GODWIT on the 21st. Also in Polk County at the Runnells WA, as seen from the overlook along hiway 316 near Swan, an AMERICAN AVOCET was observed on the 22nd, and a PERGERINE FALCON on the 21st. Elsewhere in the central in Poweshiek County, a single EURASIAN COLLARED DOVE was seen at Grinnell on both the 20th and 22nd on utility wires along 16th Avenue at the north edge of the CC golf course, while at Diamond Lake just west of Montezuma, an adult MUTE SWAN was still present on the 26th. In Greene County, both SHARP-TAILED and LECONTE'S SPARROWS were sighted at Snake Creek Marsh north of Rippey on the 22nd. In Boone County, AMERICAN PIPITS were spotted at Harrier Marsh on the 22nd, on the most easterly pond which is north of the gravel road. In Marshall County, among the 208 RAPTORS seen at the Grammer Grove Park hawk watch on the 26th, there were seven PEREGRINE FALCONS and a MERLIN.

In the northwest in Cerro Gordo County, an IBIS (Sp.) was seen on the 26th as a flyaway from a small slough, known locally as Teal Basin, which is along County Road B-20 just west of I-35. In Worth County, a PEREGRINE FALCON and MERLIN were seen north of Hanlontown on the 26th.

In the northeast in Cerro Gordo County, BLACK-THROATED BLUE and CAPE MAY WARBLERS were found at Parker's Woods in Mason City on the 22nd.

In the southeast in Marion County, a PEREGRINE FALCON was seen at the Red Rock WA in the Pinchey Bottoms area straight north of Pleasantville on the 22nd.
