On the 14th in the southeast at the Hawkeye WA in Johnson County, the 3 AMERICAN AVOCETS and a BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER were east of Greencastle Avenue north of the Swan Lake Road, while a PEREGRINE FALCON and 3 GOLDEN PLOVER were off the end of the Babcock Acess Road. The WESTERN GREBE was still present west of Greencastle Avenue on the 13th, but could not be found on the 14th. In Marion County at the Runnells overlook area off hiway 316 near Swan, 2 PEREGRINE FALCONS were present. In Des Moines County, a report from an out-of-state birder described 200 EURASIAN TREE SPARROWS along Tama Road about a mile and a half east of highway 99 just north of Burlington.

In the northeast in Cerro Gordo County, 11 WARBLER species, including GOLDEN-WINGED, were spotted at Parker's Woods in Mason City. Rita Goranson also reported a harbinger of colder weather with a WHITE-THROATED SPARROW at her feeder in Mason City.

In Dickinson County, an immature YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERON and a BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON were observed at the Spring Run complex on the 14th.

In the central in Jasper County, two juvenile COMMON TERNS were sighted at the north end of Rock Creek Lake SP just north of county road F-27. In Poweshiek County, the adult MUTE SWAN was still at Diamond Lake west of Montezuma.

The IOU fall meeting took place this past weekend in the southeast part of the state in the Ottumwa area. Field trips resulted in the sighting of 115 species, including 21 WARBLERS. The best birds were RED-SHOULDERED HAWK at Forest Lake Baptist Camp south of Ottumwa. This was also the location for most of the other good birds, which included SUMMER TANAGER, KENTUCKY, HOODED, and CERULEAN WARBLER, and WHITE-EYED VIREO. WHITE-EYED VIREO was also found at Pioneer Ridge County Park just off hiway 63 south fo Ottumwa.

The week's highlights are WESTERN GREBE and RED-NECKED PHALAROPE.

In the southeast in Johnson County at the Hawkeye WA, a WESTERN GREBE was seen far to the west of Greencastle Avenue and three AMERICAN AVOCETS were east of Greencastle Avenue north of the Swan Lake Road, while at the Babcock Acess there were 4 BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPERS and 3 GOLDEN PLOVER, all on the 12th. On the 8th an immature BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON was spotted at Swan Lake. At Iowa City's Hickory Hill Park, an interesting report was received of 2 early PURPLE FINCHES on the 11th. In Marion County in the Red Rock Reservoir area, two PEREGRINE FALCONS, a RED-NECKED PHALAROPE and 20 BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER were at the Tichy (Sp?) Bottoms area north of Pleasantville, and at the Runnells WA off hiway 316 near Swan, there were 4 RED-NECKED PHALAROPES and 12 GOLDEN PLOVER.

In the central in Boone County 2 RED-NECKED PHALAROPES and a GOLDEN PLOVER were observed at Harrier Marsh south of Ogden on the 8th.

In the northwest in Kossuth County, 2 AMERICAN AVOCETS, a RED-NECKED PHALAROPE, and 6 GOLDEN PLOVER were sighted at Union Slough NWR on the 9th. while at that location on the 11th, juvenile COMMON MOORHENS were reported.
