Birds Mentioned: Little Blue Heron American Avocet Buff-breasted Sandpiper Northern Mockingbird

All reports from the 5th are from southeast, first in Lee County, where five LITTLE BLUE HERONS, four of which were white, were seen south of Ft. Madison. The birds were along County Road X-23, about a half mile east of hiway 61. In Johnson County at the Sand Point Area of the Hawkeye WA, four AMERICAN AVOCETS were seen north of the point on an island, and BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPERS were along the west side of the Sand Pt. Road, where you walk out. Two NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRDS were spotted two and a half miles northeast of Oxford.

An amazing report came across lowa Birdchat today from two out-of-state birders. The report came from Mahaska County, and while Harley Winfrey of Missouri and Sarah Derhake of Wisconsin were driving through on 3 August at 5 PM, they saw a GREATER ROADRUNNER along hiway 63 between Montezuma and New Sharon. It was a few hundred yards northeast of the N. Skunk River. We certainly would like to have another sighting of this potential first state record bird for verification.

In Johnson County at the Hawkeye Wildlife Area, there were about 40 BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPERS along the west side of the road that you walk out to Sand Point, and two more, along with an AMERICAM GOLDEN PLOVER, were seen along the Babcock Access Road, while a WILLET was still at the end of the Bacock Access.

The week's highlights are RUFF in the southeast, and WESTERN GREBE at two locations in the northwest. In the southeast in Johnson County, nineteen species of shorebirds were seen at the Hawkeye Wildlife Area on the 31rst and 1rst. Mike Dooley was rewarded after the fifteen minute walk to Sand Point by finding a juvenile RUFF late in the afternoon of the 1rst. The bird could not be relocated later that day. There were also RUDDY TURNSTONE, AMERICAN GOLDEN PLOVER, SANDERLING, and an UPLAND SANDPIPER there on the 1rst. At the Babcock Access, there were up to 25 BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPERS along the Babcock Access Road, and a WILLET at the end of the road. To reach these areas, from North Liberty go north on hiway 965 one and three-quarters miles to the Swan Lake Road where you go west almost two and a half miles to the east end of Swan Lake, where you take a lane north to a parking lot, and then walk out to Sand Point. In another mile and a quarter along the Swan lake Road is the Babcock Access Road. Round Pond, which is off the Swan Lake Road a mile and a half west of Greencastle Avenue also has numerous shorebirds, inlcuding STILT SANDPIPERS.

In the northwest in Dickinson County, a WESTERN GREBE and two COMMOM LOONS in basic plumage were seen on Big Spirit Lake bewteen Crandall's Beach and Marble Beach on the 1rst. There was also a GREATER SCAUP in eclipse plumage (ID by length of wing stripe) at the Welch Lake WPA on the 31rst. The two adult and eight chick COMMON MOORHENS were seen again on the 1rst at the Spring Run wetland complex, specifically a half mile east of the intersection of 175th Street and 272nd Avenue. In Sac County at Black Hawk Lake at Lake View, a WESTERN GREBE was present on the 31rst. In southwest Pocahontas County, an early OLIVE-SIDED FLYCATCHER was seen at the entrance to Sunken Grove Lake on the 31rst.
