Note from Carl Wendorff re. O. G. S. Please forgive your info - probably already known to you. Regarding Ch. County - Lillian S. says the Cedar Rapids report includes 147 Goldfinches, no Crossbills & add 12 C. Jays for Clinton. Fred Fisher thought they were pinioned but further inquiry showed them to be free flying, wild-nested birds.

Regarding the Pygmy Nth. - talked to Mr. Nelson of C. R. on Friday night - a carload from C. R. went to D. M. last night saw it - he said Mr. Ely ~~was very friendly~~ was very friendly & the bird most cooperative. No photos taken. Every time said (last Mon - 2/1) he hadn't had time to go out when back in D. M. I talked to Vern Klem about it yesterday & he felt we should try to get some good photos if at all possible - said early editions of Lillian's book are way off on color for either Pygmy or Nth. - wasn't sure which. Talked to Harry Hall last Fri. also re. Nuthatches & he mentioned a Wisconsin Nth. b. b. See Am. Birds Vol. 26, p. 69608 - Milwaukee from Oct. through most of Jan., 1972 - The Passenger Pigeon produced no more detailed information. This perhaps makes an attempt to photograph the bird more important?

R. L. Greber - seen at Lock 14 late Dec. - Flocks

I seen Jan 22 - on Miss. at Cordova Nuclear Plant by Bryan Klemens, a guard who is really an out-of-work biologist & had ornithology in college.

White-fronted Geese - 2 - Cordova Nuclear Plant, Jan 22 - C. T. Evans, Bryan Klemens.

Ducks - Good numbers of Mallards & a few Black ducks wintered.

One St. Hood Duck was just out of Sav. Ch. Ct. area on count day & is now (Feb. 9) near Credit Island, often on the Ill. side where ducks are fed - a pintail is with it & many yellow divers - several hundred Goldeneyes wintered between Sav & Cordova Plant - also 75-80 C. Mergansers Goshawk - bird reported on Oshkosh St. was at Fox Valley Ill.

Red-br. Nuthatches - regular at several E. Dan. feeders.

Carolina Wren - one banded home 12/14, three present at time.

Not seen since since mid-Jan, but 1 at Credit Island early Feb.
Y-r. Warbler on Oakville Ct. at New Boston, Ill. Zuerdegg.

Blackbirds - usual numbers of wintering Red-wg. Grackles
