10 (cent.) larger than a Franklin's, I would say it was holf-way between a Ring-bill + Franklin's in size. White was almost non existent in the wing mps both at rest tim Flight. The most obvious difference was the structure of the bird. As soon as I saw it, I knew it wasn't a Franklin's'. The long neck, size, long legs, long bill, t"pot-bellied look caught my eye numediately. I guess another way to describe it was upright -looking.

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
