Body appeared rusty colored on appearparts and light underreath; very short tail; wide wingspan for body size. Was flying low to ground with regular ingleats. It landed on fence-row post a 200 yds away, and I viewed it with a 210 mm. as on 35 mm canera. No ear tutts; a 18" tall; upper body appeared golden in sunlight. Then bird flew, smalight behind reflected white on all underparts including wings and face.  Similar species and how eliminated:  Bayred owl is larger and gray.  Great Horned owl is larger, his ear tutts, and not pure white on all underparts Did anyone disagree or have reservations about identification?  No
