Bobwhite			Three separate birds calling. Heard while bicycling, N, W, and E of Town City
Upland Sandpiper	1	June 23	Highway 6 gravel pit about 2-3 pm
✓ Chuck-wills-widow	4	June 23	Johnson's Tree Farm near Eddyville 2 adults and one young were seen about 200 yards East of the Johnson house at sunset both whip-poor-will and chucks were heard. Chucks in comparison to other whip-poor-wills were larger and much browner overall. Male chucks had much more white in tail than did female. Both were seen flying directly overhead. A third adult was heard west of the house

	1	June 24	Cone Marsh wooded area east of dike
✓ yellow-headed Blackbird	1	June 21	Cone Marsh, one male in <sup>East</sup> <del>details</del> south of dike <sup>Female</sup>
✓ Lark Sparrow	1	June 23	within 1 1/2 mile of <sup>East</sup> first sighting of Hooded warbler in Amara woods
