I observed this first year bird sitting on the ice with many Herring and several Ring-billed Gulls immediately above Lock 13. The bird was intermediate in size between the Herring and Ring-bills. The bird was always observed sitting. The primaries were not as dark as those of the Herring. The back was lighter and more uniform and scaly in appearance as compared to the Herring Gulls. The bill was completely dark and the eye was dark with a darkish smudge around the eye. The bird was about 100 feet away. I observed it with Leica Ultra 10x42 binoculars and a Bushnell Spacemaster 20-45x spotting scope. The light conditions were poor as it was foggy, however the bird was very close.

I observed the first year bird foraging at Lock 14 at about 12:30 with many Herring and several Ring-billed Gulls. The bird was slightly smaller than the Herring and larger than the Ring-bills. The bird was always seen flying. Primaries were whiteish below and darker than mantle at top. However, the primary and secondary tips were not as dark as those of the Herring. The bird had a brownish gray tail band, not as dark as those of the Ring-bills. The bill appeared to be all dark. The light was adequate. I ~~had~~ observed the bird at about 250 yards using Leica Ultra 10x42 binoculars and a Bushnell Spacemaster 20-45x Spotting Scope. Growth.
