I was hunting Ring-necked Pheasant and Common Bobuhite on the Wordell Tuttle farm and noticed a to large hawk to the south of me flying parallel to astand of Osage Orange trees. It was flying to the East when it turned and flew toward my position. As it came toward me it had the typical shape of an accipiter. As it flew approximately 50 to 75 feet above me I could easily see the bird had a clean grong slightly barred breast and a large white stripe above its eye. As it flew away it looked as if its under tail coverts were sticking out on each side of its tail, they were also white. The back was an overall steel gray color and the wings were dark gray to black color. The birds tail was long and lightly banded and appeared to be a medium gray on top.

Similar species and how eliminated: Coopers Hank does not have a white experipe or white fluffy white under tail coverts. Coopers also has a read ish barring to the breast in the adult plumeage and is browney above not gray.
