We were driving East on a gravel road on the East side of Sweet Marsh when Bob voticed a Falcon-like bird flying across the field to our Right. The bird over took us and flew alongside the car for a while before flying in front of the car hood at about 20 feet ahead of us. It then flew low to the ground over a cultivated field to our left and landed in the field. We could not locate the bird again to view it with a telescope. The bird had a very strong flight with constant short wingbeats. Flight was falcon-like with short pointed wings. The bird had a dark bluish back and black primaries and a dark cap. The tail was dark with 4 or 5 darker bonds on it that really stood out and were easy to see. The breast and belly had dark striping on them. No facial pattern could be seen other than the tak cap on top of the head. No voice was heard.

Similar species and how eliminated: Peregrine Falcon is larger with dark facial pattern Peregrine breast is also barred not streaked.
