As we drove along highway # 330 heading south I spotted 3 birds soaring in circles, all different sizes. The middlesized appeared to be a buteo, but I concentrated on the largest bird. It was Auge, with a slight dihedral, holding steady in the north wind. Seen against the bright sky it Was an all-dark bird except for 3 white areas _ 2 brilliant large white circles at the base of the primaries, showing like lights on the dark body. Also white was the base of the tail that had a dark terminal band. Looking like an overgrown buteo it flew directly overhead & slightly to my right, fairly low, as our car spedon. With the white areas where they were on an otherwise dark body it could have been nothing but an immature Golden Eagle, Similar species and how eliminated: A Rough-leg dark-morph adult & has a similar tail, but does not have an all-dark body a the white

on underwings is near wing tips.
