We were watching gulls down river from the dom outlet. They were feeding on shad at a bend in the river. One of the gulls was much larger than the others. This bird was overall a medium beige color with no trace of black in the wing tips. It was larger than the therring Gulls flying nearby. The bill was large with the tip black. The basal 3/4 was a light brownish to tan color, I feel this bird was too light and feather worn to be a 1st year winter bird. It was more of a sandy color with very little feather edging on the wing coverts + tertials. This bird was more than likely a 2nd winter bird.

Similar species and how eliminated: This bird too large for Iceland and thayer's Gulls.
