Slightly smaller than nearby Herring Gulls. Bill bright yellow-orange with red spot on lower culmen. Eye yellow. Head and underparts white, with light gray streaks on crown, nape, and side of neck. Dark gray mantle, back, and wings. Primaries on sitting bird black with white tips. Legs and feet bright yellow.

The bird was seen swimming and sitting on ice with many Herring Gulls.

Similar species; how eliminated: Great Black-backed Gull is much larger, has a blacker back, and pale pink legs. Herring Gull has a lighter gray mantle and pink legs.

Did anyone disagree or have reservations about the identification? No.

Viewing conditions: Full sunlight, 50 yards away. Viewed with 8×40 binoculars and 15x - 45x telescope.

Previous experience with species and similar ones: Minimal experience with Lesser Black-backed Gull; very familiar with Herring Gull.
