Description of bird: The chunky body, weak flight, dangling legs, short neck, and stubby bill identified the bird as a rail. In flight, the back and wings were a light buffy brown except for a large, white patch on the trailing edge of each wing. Despite the generally poor viewing conditions, I got a good enough look to positively identify the bird.

Similar species and how eliminated: All other rails eliminated by the white wing patches.

Viewing conditions and equipment: Viewing conditions were not very good-sky partly cloudy and I was looking almost directly into the sun. Estimated viewing distance was 15 ft at the closest. No optical equipment was used.

Previous experience with species: I have seen several Yellow Rails in Iowa.
