Also mention voice and behavior. I went To the Macbride Field Campus looking for a Coshawk. As noted about, one had been seen there on our Christmas count. While driving I noticed a fairly large hawk pearched in a bare decidance tree. I stopped quickly and observed a dark capped hawk with a white eyebrow strip.
The stripe was wider at the back of the head than over the eye. The rest of the head was an overall gray with the face and checks being whitish. The back and wings of the bird were a Lurk blue gray. I observed the bird for 1655 than a minute before it flew. In flight the underparts were seen, they were an off white color.
I drovt on and figured I wouldn't see the bird again. However, as
I camt around a corner approaching the west parking lot I got a quick look at the bird as it flow. Largesized blue-gray upperparts, and long
trill were noted. Wingbeat stemed strong as the bird film below the treeted level into a ravine. I chased but couldnot locate the bird again.
Rounded wings were not observed but I saw nothing to indicate they were long and pointed as a falcon.
Similar species and how eliminated: large size and eyebrow strip eliminate other accipiters. Butto's are generally prowner, shorter tail, and also lack an eyebrow strip. Osprey is also browner and has more extensive white on the head. Osprey also would have noticibly long wings. Did anyone disagree or have reservations about the identification?
